Response and/or Clarifications to Remaining Questions – Substance Abuse Testing - 11CT77463YA”

Note: The first two questions below are as a response to questions No. 14 and 15 under Addendum No. 2.

Who are these laboratory tests for? **There will not be any laboratory screens; all of the centers have converted to the instant kits.**

How come there are only 500 laboratory drug screens? What happened to the other 500 samples that were collected? **There will now be no laboratory screens required.**

If the 1,000 onsite urine collections are tested with an instant urine drug kit then how can there be an estimated 3,000? What happened to the other 2,000? **The total estimated number of tests needed for all locations combined is 3,000.**
