

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SECTION 1
INTRODUCTION AND INSTRUCTIONS TO PROPOSERS

1.1 PURPOSE

Fulton County, Georgia (“County”) is requesting proposals from organizations and individuals who have substantial and effective experience and qualifications in providing interiorscape design and installation services.

Through the issuance of this Request For Proposal (“RFP” and/or “Proposals”), the County is soliciting Proposals from qualified Proposers for the Justice Center Memorial Garden – interiorscape design and installation services.

Proposals provided in response to this RFP that comply with the submittal requirements set forth in Section 3.0, including all forms and certifications, will be evaluated in accordance with the criteria and procedures described in Section 4.0. Based on the results of the evaluation, the County will award the Justice Center Memorial Garden – interiorscape design and installation to the most advantageous Proposer based on the cost and the evaluation factors set forth in the RFP.

1.2 BACKGROUND

This project involves the design, fabrication and installation of a living memorial garden to commemorate the events of March 11, 2005 to be located in the Fulton County Justice Center Tower Atrium. Serving as a place of reflection and repose the garden will offer the soothing sounds of running water and the visual and aromatic effects of lush foliage and seasonal flowering plants.

On March 11, 2005 a violent inmate overtook a deputy sheriff, took possession of that deputy’s weapon and made his way into the Chambers of Judge Rowland Barnes. The incident ended in the death of Judge Barnes, Court Reporter Julie Brandau, Deputy Sheriff Hoyt Teasley and David Wilhelm. Others were held hostage and injured during the ordeal which has left a permanent imprint on the Fulton County Community at large.

The Garden should be designed to memorialize the beauty of four lives taken tragically, giving the survivors a place to remember the goodness of life and hope for tomorrow.

1.3 PROPOSAL DUE DATE

All proposals are due in the Purchasing Department of Fulton County located in the Public Safety Building, Suite 1168, 130 Peachtree St., S.W., Atlanta, Georgia 30303 on or before **Thursday, August 24, 2006 at 11:00 A.M.**, legal prevailing time. All submitted proposals will be time and date stamped according to the clock at the front desk of the Fulton County Purchasing Department. Any proposals received after this appointed schedule will be considered late and subject to be returned unopened to the Proposer. The proposal due date can be changed only by addendum.

1.4 DELIVERY REQUIREMENTS

Any proposal received after the above stipulated due date and time will not be considered and will be rejected and returned. It shall be the sole responsibility of the Proposer to have his/her proposal delivered to the Fulton County Purchasing Department for receipt on or before the above stipulated due date and time. If a proposal is sent by U.S.Mail, the Proposer shall be responsible for its timely delivery to the Purchasing Department.

1.5 CONTACT PERSON AND INQUIRIES

Any questions or suggestions regarding this RFP should be submitted in writing to the Purchasing Department contact person, Donald R. Riley, Assistant Purchasing Agent, 130 Peachtree St., S.W., Suite 1168, Atlanta, Georgia 30303, phone (404) 730-7916, fax (404) 893-1876, e-mail: donald.riley@co.fulton.ga.us. Any responses made by the County will be provided in writing to all Proposers by addendum. No verbal responses shall be authoritative.

1.6 NO CONTACT DURING PROCUREMENT PROCESS

It is the policy of Fulton County that the evaluation and award process for County contracts shall be free from both actual and perceived impropriety, and that contacts between potential vendors and County officials, elected officials and staff regarding pending awards of County contracts shall be prohibited.

- A. No person, firm, or business entity, however situated or composed, obtaining a copy of or responding to this solicitation, shall initiate or continue any verbal or written communication regarding this solicitation with any County officer, elected official, employee, or designated County representative, between the date of the issuance of this solicitation and the date of the County Manager's recommendation to the Board of Commissioners for award of the subject contract, except as may otherwise be specifically authorized and permitted by the terms and conditions of this solicitation.
- B. All verbal and written communications initiated by such person, firm, or entity regarding this solicitation, if same are authorized and permitted by the terms and conditions of this solicitation, shall be directed to the Purchasing Agent.
- C. Any violation of this prohibition of the initiation or continuation of verbal or written communications with County officers, elected officials, employees, or designated County representatives shall result in a written finding by the Purchasing Agent that the submitted bid or proposal of the person, firm, or entity in violation is "non-responsive", and same shall not be considered for award.

1.7 CLARIFICATION & ADDENDA

Proposers may submit requests for clarifications or interpretations regarding this RFP and the Contract. Proposers must prepare such requests in writing for the County's consideration as set forth in this section of this RFP. While the County has not placed an initial limitation on the number of requests which can be submitted, Proposers are cautioned that if Proposers do not request meaningful clarifications or interpretations in

an organized manner (e.g., limited frequency of requests), the County will set restrictions on the frequency and number of requests permitted. The County will not respond to requests received after **Friday, August 18, 2006 at 5:00 PM**, local prevailing time. Proposers are advised that this section places no obligation on the part of the County to respond to any or all requests for clarification or interpretation, and that the County's failure to respond to any such request will not relieve the Proposer of any obligations or conditions required by this RFP.

All responses to written requests for clarification, interpretation, or additional information will be distributed as addenda to this RFP to all persons registered with the County to have received a copy of the RFP.

No oral interpretation, instruction, or information concerning this RFP given by any employee or agent of the County shall be binding on the County. Proposers who submit a Proposal in reliance on any such oral information risk having their response to this RFP deemed non-responsive by the County. Only written responses issued by addendum to this RFP should be considered by the Proposers.

During the period provided for the preparation of Proposals, the County may issue addenda to this RFP. These addenda will be numbered consecutively and will be distributed to those who have been issued a copy of this RFP. Additionally, the addenda will be posted on the Fulton County website, www.co.fulton.ga.us. These addenda will be issued by, or on behalf of, the County and will constitute a part of this RFP. Each Proposer is required to acknowledge by submitting an executed acknowledgment form included as Technical Proposal Form 2. This acknowledgment shall include all addenda distributed prior to the Proposal Submission Date. All responses to this RFP shall be prepared with full consideration of the addenda issued prior to the Proposal Submission Date.

1.8 TERM OF CONTRACT

The initial term of the contract shall be for thirty (30) days from receipt of the Notice to Proceed.

1.9 REQUIRED SUBMITTALS

This is a checklist for the forms and affidavits that must be submitted. This section does not contain instructions for submission:

- Technical Proposal
- Cost Proposal

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- Certification of Acceptance of Proposal Requirements
 - Receipt of Addenda (If necessary)
 - Insurance and Risk Management Provisions

1.10 PROPOSAL EVALUATION

All proposals will be evaluated using the criteria specified in Section 3 of this RFP. Selection will include an analysis of proposals by a selection committee composed of three/two members from the Office of the County Manager and one/two Purchasing Staff who will review the proposal submittals in accordance with the submittal requirements and the evaluation criteria set forth in Section 3 of this RFP. The committee may request oral interviews and/or site visits.

1.11 DISQUALIFICATION OF PROPOSERS

The submission of more than one (1) proposal to the County as the primary Proposer or member of a joint venture for the same work by an individual firm, partnership or corporation under the same or different names may be considered as sufficient for disqualification of a Proposer and the rejection of the proposal.

1.12 RESERVED RIGHTS

The County reserves the right to accept or reject any and/or all proposals, to waive irregularities and technicalities, and to request resubmission. Any sole response that is received may or may not be rejected by the County depending on available competition and timely needs of the County. There is no obligation on the part of the County to award the contract to the lowest proposer and the County reserves the right to award the contract to the responsible proposers submitting responsive proposals with resulting agreements most advantageous and in the best interest of the County. The County shall be the sole judge of the proposals and the resulting agreements that are in its best interest and its decision shall be final. Also, the County reserves the right to make such investigation as it deems necessary to determine the ability of any proposer to perform the work or service requested. Information the County deems necessary to make this determination shall be provided by the proposer. Such information may include, but shall not be limited to, current financial statements by an independent CPA; verification of availability of personnel; and past performance records.

1.13 APPLICABLE LAWS

All applicable laws and regulations of the State of Georgia and ordinances and regulations of Fulton County shall apply. Protestors shall seek resolution of their complaints in the manner provided in the Fulton County Code of Laws §2-324 which is incorporated by reference herein.

1.14 INSURANCE AND RISK MANAGEMENT PROVISIONS

Insurance and Risk Management provisions and Indemnification and Hold Harmless provisions are outlined in Section 4 of this RFP.

1.15 ACCURACY OF RFP AND RELATED DOCUMENTS

The County assumes no responsibility that the specified technical and background information presented in this RFP, or otherwise distributed or made available during this procurement process, is complete or accurate. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the County will not be bound by or be responsible for any explanation or interpretation of the Proposal documents other than those given in writing as an addendum to this RFP.

Should a recipient of this RFP find discrepancies in or omissions from this RFP and related documents, the recipient of this RFP shall immediately notify the Purchasing Contact Person identified in Section 1.10 in writing at the following address: Fulton County Purchasing Department, Public Safety Bldg, 130 Peachtree Street S.E., Suite 1168 Atlanta, GA 30303. A written addendum, if necessary, then will be made available to each recipient of this RFP.

1.16 RESPONSIBILITY OF PROPOSER

Each Proposer is encouraged to conduct all necessary investigations and review all available and relevant data and information, which are necessary in its judgment in order to assume this responsibility prior to the submittal of its Proposal. Proposers are reminded of Fulton County's "**No Contact During Procurement**" policy and may only contact the person designated by the RFP.

1.17 CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION

If any Proposal contains technical, financial, or other confidential information that the Proposer believes is exempt from disclosure, the Proposer must clearly label the specific portions sought to be kept confidential and specify on what the exemption is based. The County, at its sole discretion and subject to applicable law, will determine whether such exemption applies. The County has sole discretion to make such determination regarding the disclosure of information, and by responding to this RFP, Proposers waive any challenge to the County's decisions in this regard. Marking all or substantially all of a Proposal as confidential may result in the Proposer being deemed non-responsive to this RFP.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, Proposers recognize and agree that the County, its staff, and its Consultants will not be responsible or liable in any way for any losses that the Proposer may suffer from the disclosure of information or materials to third parties.

1.18 COUNTY RIGHTS AND OPTIONS

This RFP constitutes an invitation to submit Proposals to the County. Without limitation or penalty, the County reserves and holds at its sole discretion, the following rights and options:

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- This RFP does not obligate the County to select, procure or contract for any services whatsoever
 - The County reserves the right to change or alter the schedule for any events associated with this procurement and, if required, notify the Proposers. A Proposer, by submitting a Proposal, agrees to be bound by any modifications made by the County
 - All costs incurred by a Proposer in connection with responding to this RFP, the evaluation and selection process undertaken in connection with this procurement, and any negotiations with the County will be borne by the Proposer.
 - The County reserves the right to reject all Proposals and components thereof to eliminate all Proposers responding to this RFP from further consideration for this procurement, and to notify such Proposers of the County's determination.
 - The County may cancel this RFP without the substitution of another RFP and terminate this procurement at any time without any liability whatsoever.
 - The County reserves the right to waive any technicalities or irregularities in the Proposals.
 - The County reserves the right to eliminate any Proposer who submits incomplete or inadequate responses or is not responsive to the requirements of this RFP.
 - The County may request Proposers to send representatives to the County for interviews and presentations.
 - To the extent deemed appropriate by the County, the County may select and enter into discussion and negotiations with the Proposer(s) submitting Proposal(s), which are found to be reasonably susceptible for award.
 - The County reserves the right to discontinue negotiations with any selected Proposer.
 - The County reserves the right, without prior notice, to supplement, amend, or otherwise modify this RFP.
 - All Proposals (other than portions thereof subject to patent or copyright protection) become the property of the County and will not be returned, and the County reserves the right to utilize all such information contained in the Proposals without further cost to the County
 - The County may add to or delete from the Project Scope of Work set forth in this RFP.
 - Any and all Proposals not received by the Proposal Submission Date shall be

rejected and returned unopened.

- Neither the County, its staff, its representatives, nor any of its consultants or attorneys will be liable for any claims or damages resulting from the solicitation, collection, review, or evaluation of responses to this RFP.
- The County, including its representatives and consultants, reserves the right to visit and examine any of the facilities referenced in any Proposal and to observe and investigate the operations of such facilities.
- The County reserves the right to conduct investigations of the Proposers and their responses to this RFP and to request additional evidence to support the information included in any such response.

By responding to this RFP, Proposers acknowledge and consent to the rights and conditions set forth in this RFP.

1.19 COST OF PROPOSAL PREPARATION AND SELECTION PROCESS

Each Proposal, including preparation of all information required to be included in a Proposal pursuant to this RFP, shall be prepared at the sole cost and expense (including, but not limited to, engineering and legal costs) of the Proposer. In addition, the Proposer shall be solely responsible for all costs (including engineering and legal costs) incurred by such Proposer in connection with this selection process, including any costs incurred by the Proposer in any subsequent negotiations entered into in connection with developing the Proposal. There shall be no claims whatsoever against the County, its staff, or its consultants for reimbursement for the costs or expenses (including, but not limited to, engineering and legal costs) incurred during the preparation of the Proposal or other information required by this RFP or procurement process or in connection with the selection process or any negotiations.

1.20 TERMINATION OF NEGOTIATIONS

The County at its sole discretion may, at any time, to the extent permitted by Applicable Law, exclude a Proposer from further participation in any negotiation process if the County determines that such Proposer is failing to progress in the negotiations or if the terms of its Proposal are less advantageous than those of other Proposers and such Proposer is deemed to be no longer susceptible of selection. The County will give written notice of its decision to the Proposer, which shall be sent in writing, signed by the County.

1.21 WAGE CLAUSE

Pursuant to 102-391, Each Contractor shall agree that in the performance of the Contract he will comply with all lawful agreements, if any, which the Contractor had made with any association, union, or other entity, with respect to wages, salaries, and working conditions, so as not to cause inconvenience, picketing, or work stoppage.

1.22 ADDITIONAL OR SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION

After receipt of the submittals, the County will evaluate the responses, including the references, financial statements, experience and other data relating to the Respondent's qualifications. If requested by the Fulton County Purchasing Department, Respondent's may required to submit additional or supplemental information to determine whether the Respondent meets all of the qualification requirements.

**SECTION 2
PROPOSAL REQUIREMENTS**

2.1 SCOPE OF WORK

The Fulton County Board of Commissioners will contract an individual or team to work in consultation with the Fulton County Justice Center Memorial Committee which includes representatives of the Fulton County Superior Court, the Fulton County Sheriff's Department, the Fulton County General Services Department and Fulton County's Public Art Program. The selected proposal will receive a contract for the design, fabrication, and installation of the Memorial Garden.

The garden is meant to serve as a place of reflection and repose, offering the soothing sounds of running water, the visual and aromatic effects of lush foliage while being surrounded with seasonal flowering plants.

This Memorial Garden Project shall require the following features:

- Lush foliage
- Seasonal Flowering Plants
- Re-circulating water features
- A marker which tells the story of March 11, 2005 and holds words of reflection

The garden is to be located in an alcove off the Justice Center Tower Atrium, behind Manuel Alvarez's marble sculpture *Sardana, Dance of Peace*, which is the focal point of the 185 Central Avenue Entrance. This alcove is also visible from the second and third floors. While the garden cannot abut the existing sculpture, it is possible for it to "spill out" of the alcove to the left and right of the opening. Portraits of the victims of March 11th will be hung on the southwest (SW) wall of the atrium. The existing plants and time capsule which are visible in the photos (Section 6 marked Exhibits) will be removed from their current positions.

The southwest (SW), northwest (NW) and northeast (NE) walls of the alcove are glass overlooking a small, unattractive and inaccessible courtyard with pavers and the adjoining building. Heating supply and return ducts are located at the base of these three (3) walls. There is a pitched glass ceiling.

Alcove dimensions are: 22 ft. 11 $\frac{3}{4}$ in. (L) x 5 ft (D) x 8 ft. 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. (H)

Area available to the left and right of alcove: 13 ft x 4 ft each side.

It is fifteen inches (15") from floor to top of heating ducts with 9 $\frac{3}{4}$ inch sills on three (3) walls.

All components must be constructed of sturdy, low-maintenance materials and must account for variable climatic conditions and light levels. Consideration should be taken of uses of space, traffic patterns, existing artwork, surrounding architecture and construction materials.

The area has Terrazzo flooring and was not constructed as an interior planting space. The floor must be adequately protected from moisture. It is anticipated that the resulting garden will be in containers of some sort. Weight is a consideration. The weight of the project in any given area cannot exceed the weight of a tightly spaced grouping of people in the same area.

2.2 PROPOSAL FORMAT

The Proposal Format shall include the appropriate and requested information in sufficient detail to demonstrate expertise in interiorscape design, fabrication and installation through prior experience with similar or related interior projects and a thorough understanding of this projects unique and sensitive nature by providing an innovative and realistic visual and verbal proposal for the site.

The Technical Proposal shall be arranged and include content as described below:

A. Executive Summary

The executive summary shall include a brief statement of approach to the work, understanding of the goals and objectives and demonstrated understanding of the County's needs

B. Organization

1. General information on the business location, address, telephone number, and the name(s) of officers or individuals who are authorized to enter into a written agreement with Fulton County
2. Name, address, phone and fax number and e-mail address of principal point of contact all future correspondence and/or communications will be directed to for this project

C. Experience

1. Provide a short narrative of the firm and staff's demonstrated ability to perform the proposed services
2. Provide a minimum of two (2) references of public sector organizations of similar size to Fulton County for which the firm has performed professional services related to providing public relations services in the past two (2) years. Include contact name, title, and telephone number, dollar value of contract, and brief description of services provided

D. Qualifications of Key Staff

1. Provide the qualifications of the individuals to be assigned to the engagement. Include a statement of duties expected to be performed by each individual and the percentage of time that individual will spend on this project

E. Comprehension of Scope of Work

1. Provide a summary of the firm's understanding of the work to be performed by task. Include the steps expected to be performed to complete each task

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2. Provide a timeline of the work expected to be performed by task, with approximate day(s) to be performed

F. Financial Responsibility

1. Provide your most recent annual report and financial statement

G. Location of firm

Please provide the business location (the term business location means a physical structure, office or suite but does not include a post-office box or temporary job or project site location) of the Proposer. If submitting as a Joint Venture or Partnership, provide a copy of the executed Joint Venture or Partnership Agreement including the business address of all members.

H. Cost Proposal

The Cost Proposal shall be provided in a **separate sealed envelope** in accordance with section 2.1 of this RFP. The Cost Proposal shall include current information and shall be arranged and include content as described below:

Section 1 - Introduction

The Proposer shall include an introduction which outlines the contents of the Cost Proposal.

- Overall budget which includes project costs for time, materials and overhead

2.3 PROJECT DELIVERABLES

The Proposer will deliver the following products to the County at the completion of this project:

1. Durability and ease of maintenance
2. Appropriateness to site in terms of scale, color, material, texture, content and social dynamics
3. Five (5) copies of the Development Plan that addresses all of the work elements required in Section 2.1 of this RFP.

**SECTION 3
EVALUATION CRITERIA**

3.1 PROPOSAL EVALUATION – SELECTION CRITERIA

The following criteria will be used to evaluate the proposals submitted in response to this RFP:

SECTION 4
INSURANCE AND RISK MANAGEMENT PROVISIONS

Insurance and Risk Management Provisions

It is Fulton County Government's practice to obtain Certificates of Insurance from our Contractors and Vendors. Insurance must be written by a licensed agent in a company licensed to write insurance in the State of Georgia. Respondents shall submit with the bid/proposal evidence of insurability satisfactory to Fulton County Government as to form and content. Either of the following forms of evidence is acceptable:

- A letter from an insurance carrier stating that upon your firm/company being the successful Bidder/Respondent that a Certificate of Insurance shall be issued in compliance with the Insurance and Risk Management Provisions outlined below.
- A Certificate of Insurance complying with the Insurance and Risk Management Provisions outlined below (Request for Bid/Proposal number and Project Description must appear on the Certificate of Insurance).

Upon award, the Contractor/Vendor must maintain at their expense, insurance with policy limits equal to or greater than the limits described below. Any and all Insurance Coverage(s) and Bonds required under the terms and conditions of the contract shall be maintained during the entire length of the contract, including any extensions or renewals thereto, and until all work has been completed to the satisfaction of Fulton County Government.

Accordingly the Respondent shall provide a certificate evidencing the following:

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USE OF PREMISES

Contractor shall confine its apparatus; the storage of materials and the operations of its workers to limits/requirements indicated by law, ordinance, permits and any restrictions of Fulton County Government and shall not unreasonably encumber the premises with its materials.

PROTECTION OF PROPERTY

Contractor will adequately protect its own work from damage, will protect Fulton County Government's property from damage or loss and will take all necessary precautions during the progress of the work to protect all persons and the property of others from damage or loss.

Contractor shall take all necessary precautions for the safety of employees of the work and shall comply with all applicable provisions of the Federal, State and local safety laws and building codes to prevent accidents or injury to persons on, about, or adjacent to the premises where work is being performed.

Contractor shall erect and properly maintain at all times as required by the conditions and progress of the work, all necessary safeguards for the protection of its employees, Fulton County Government employees and the public and shall post all applicable signage and other warning devices to protect against potential hazards for the work being performed.

INDEMNIFICATION AND HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT

Contractor/Vendor further agrees to protect, defend, indemnify and hold harmless Fulton County, its Commissioners, officers, employees, subcontractors, successors, assigns and agents from and against any and all claims or liability for compensation under the Worker's Compensation Act, Disability Benefits Act, or any other employee benefits act arising out of injuries sustained by any employees of Contractor/Vendor. These indemnities shall not be limited by reason of the listing of any insurance coverage.

If the bid/quotation involves construction services Contractor/Vendor will be responsible fully for any and all damage to the work during the course of construction, until the point of Final acceptance by Fulton County.

FULTON COUNTY ACKNOWLEDGES THAT ALL PROVISIONS OF THIS INDEMNITY AGREEMENT MAY NOT BE APPLICABLE TO THE CONTRACTOR/VENDOR'S BUSINESS. TO THE EXTENT THAT CONTRACTOR/VENDOR MAY DEMONSTRATE SUCH NONAPPLICABILITY, FULTON COUNTY MAY NEGOTIATE AMENDMENTS TO THIS AGREEMENT AS THE CIRCUMSTANCES DICTATE.
