

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# SECTION 1 INTRODUCTION

## 1.1 PURPOSE

Fulton County, Georgia (“County”) is seeking qualified firms to provide transportation services for the Health and Human Services Agency. The objective of this procurement is to obtain the services of qualified firm(s) to provide, Safe Mobility that is Accessible, Reliable and offers Top quality customer service (SMART) for consumers authorized by the Fulton County Health and Human Services Agency.

The County seeks to obtain the most cost-effective and efficient transportation services from Proposers who will operate with a maximum level of customer service and safety. The successful Proposer(s) for each Service Delivery option shall be responsible for receiving trip requests from eligible seniors and facilities; scheduling requested trips; dispatching vehicles (Call Center Operations) and; maintaining a database of eligible clients as assigned. Fulton County’s Office of Aging is responsible for client eligibility. Service Delivery Area(s) include the following:

- Service Delivery Area, Option 1 – North Fulton Facility Transportation
- Service Delivery Area, Option 2 – Central Fulton Facility Transportation
- Service Delivery Area, Option 3 – South Fulton Facility Transportation
- Service Delivery, Option 4 – Non-Emergency Medical Services (Demand Response and Subscription Services)

See Appendix A, Service Options for details and historical data on the options. A Proposer may submit a proposal on one or more Service Delivery Area option(s) by submitting a separate proposal for each option in which it is interested.

Through the issuance of this Request for Proposal (“RFP” and/or “Proposals”), the County is soliciting Proposals from qualified Proposers for Health and Human Services Transportation Services.

Proposals provided in response to this RFP that comply with the submittal requirements set forth in Section 3.0, including all forms and certifications, will be evaluated in accordance with the criteria and procedures described in Section 4.0. Based on the results of the evaluation, the County will award the project to the most advantageous Proposer(s) based on the cost and the evaluation factors set forth in the RFP. The County may contract with a combination of qualified vendors in order to service all of Fulton County. The county reserves the right to make multiple awards under this request for proposals.

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## 1.2 DESCRIPTION OF THE PROJECT

This project involves the provision of transportation services for the Health and Human Services Agency's programs. Selected vendors must have the capability and capacity to provide such transportation in appropriate vehicles, maintain a fleet of vehicles that can provide services safely and reliably, implement a vehicle replacement plan that will ensure the use of appropriate vehicles, provide such services exhibiting excellent customer service and respect for consumers, and report activities in a form acceptable to the County.

## 1.3 BACKGROUND

It is the practice of the Fulton County Health and Human Services Agency to provide quality and cost effective transportation to eligible consumers for those services designed to enhance health, independence, and self-sufficiency provided through the Office of Aging and Division of Behavioral Health. These services have been provided through various methods including direct service, direct contracts with the County, and, most recently, using the State of Georgia, Department of Human Services Coordinated Transportation System. This solicitation seeks to identify a vendor(s) that will contract directly with Fulton County to provide services.

The General Services Department, Transportation and Logistics Division will be responsible for ensuring that the equipment/vehicles used for transportation services are safe, dependable and suitable for the program.

## 1.4 COUNTY OBJECTIVES

The following are the County Objectives for this project:

- Provide SMART Transportation Services to eligible Fulton County residents to service sites.

**Safe**  
**Mobility**  
**Accessible**  
**Reliable**  
**Top Quality Customer Service**

- Connect eligible Fulton County residents to services that enhance their quality of life.

## 1.7 PRE-PROPOSAL CONFERENCE

The County will hold a Pre-Proposal Conference, on **Thursday, April 14, 2011 at 10:00 A.M.**, in the Bid Conference Room of the Department of Purchasing and Contract Compliance, Fulton County Public Safety Building, Suite 1168, 130 Peachtree Street, S.W., Atlanta, Georgia 30303. Attendance at the Pre-Proposal Conference is voluntary for responding to this RFP, however Proposers are encouraged to attend. The purpose of the Pre-Proposal Conference is to provide information regarding the project and to address any questions and concerns regarding the services sought by the County through this RFP.

## 1.8 PROPOSAL DUE DATE

All proposals are due in the Department of Purchasing and Contract Compliance of Fulton County located in the Public Safety Building, Suite 1168, 130 Peachtree St, S.W., Atlanta Georgia 30303 on or before **Monday, May 2, 2011 at 11:00 A.M.**, local prevailing time. All submitted proposals will be time and date stamped according to the clock at the front desk of the Fulton County Department of Purchasing and Contract Compliance. Any proposals received after this appointed schedule will be considered late and subject to be returned unopened to the Proposer. The proposal due date can be changed only by addendum.

## 1.9 DELIVERY REQUIREMENTS

Any proposal received after the above stipulated due date and time will not be considered and will be rejected and returned. It shall be the sole responsibility of the Proposer to have his/her proposal delivered to the Fulton County Department of Purchasing and Contract Compliance for receipt on or before the above stipulated due date and time. If a proposal is sent by U.S. Mail, the proposer shall be responsible for its timely delivery to the Department of Purchasing and Contract Compliance.

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## **1.10 CONTACT PERSON AND INQUIRIES**

Any questions or suggestions regarding this RFP should be submitted in writing to the Purchasing Department contact person, Donald R. Riley, CPPB, Assistant Purchasing Agent, 130 Peachtree Street S.W., Suite 1168, Atlanta, Georgia 30303. Any response made by the County will be provided in writing to all Proposers by addendum. No verbal responses shall be authoritative.

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## SECTION 2 INSTRUCTIONS TO PROPOSERS

### 2.1 PROCUREMENT PROCESS

The procurement will be on a formally advertised basis. All technical requirements, unless otherwise specified, must be met, or be capable of being met by the Proposer or their proposal will be disqualified as being non-responsive.

### 2.2 CONTRACT DEFINITIONS

In addition to any other terms that may be defined in this solicitation, the following terms have the following meaning:

**Addendum** – Revision to the RFP documents issued by the County prior to the receipt of proposals.

**Agreement** – refers to the executed contract between the County and Contracting Entity.

**County** – Fulton County Government and its authorized representatives.

**Contact Person** – Purchasing staff designated by the Fulton County Department of Purchasing and Contract Compliance to submit any questions and suggestions to.

**Proposer** – the entity of individual submitting a proposal in response to this RFP.

**Owner** – Fulton County Government

**Proposal** – the document submitted by the Proposer in response to this RFP.

**Proposer** – the entity or individual submitting a proposal in response to his RFP.

**Scope of Work** – All the services specified, indicated, shown, or contemplated by the Contract, and furnishing by the Contractor of all materials, equipment, labor, methods, processes, construction and manufacturing materials and equipment, tools, plants, supplies, power, water, transportation and other things necessary to complete such services in accordance with the Contract.

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## 2.3 NO CONTACT DURING PROCUREMENT PROCESS

It is the policy of Fulton County that the evaluation and award process for County contracts shall be free from both actual and perceived impropriety, and that contacts between potential vendors and County officials, elected officials and staff regarding pending awards of County contracts shall be prohibited.

- A. No person, firm, or business entity, however situated or composed, obtaining a copy of or responding to this solicitation, shall initiate or continue any verbal or written communication regarding this solicitation with any County officer, elected official, employee, or designated County representative, between the date of the issuance of this solicitation and the date of the County Manager's recommendation to the Board of Commissioners for award of the subject contract, except as may otherwise be specifically authorized and permitted by the terms and conditions of this solicitation.
- B. All verbal and written communications initiated by such person, firm, or entity regarding this solicitation, if same are authorized and permitted by the terms and conditions of this solicitation, shall be directed to the Purchasing Agent.
- C. Any violation of this prohibition of the initiation or continuation of verbal or written communications with County officers, elected officials, employees, or designated County representatives shall result in a written finding by the Purchasing Agent that the submitted bid or proposal of the person, firm, or entity in violation is "non-responsive", and same shall not be considered for award.

## 2.4 CLARIFICATION & ADDENDA

Proposers may submit requests for clarifications or interpretations regarding this RFP and the Contract. Proposers must prepare such requests in writing for the County's consideration as set forth in this section of this RFP. While the County has not placed an initial limitation on the number of requests which can be submitted, Proposers are cautioned that if Proposers do not request meaningful clarifications or interpretations in an organized manner (e.g., limited frequency of requests), the County will set restrictions on the frequency and number of requests permitted. The County will not respond to requests, oral or written, received after **April 25, 2011 at 2:00 P.M.**, local prevailing time. Proposers are advised that this section places no obligation on the part of the County to respond to any or all requests for clarification or interpretation, and that the

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County's failure to respond to any such request will not relieve the Proposer of any obligations or conditions required by this RFP.

All responses to written requests for clarification, interpretation, or additional information will be distributed as addenda to this RFP and posted on the Fulton County website [www.fultoncountyga.gov](http://www.fultoncountyga.gov).

No oral interpretation, instruction, or information concerning this RFP given by any employee or agent of the County shall be binding on the County. Proposers who submit a Proposal in reliance on any such oral information risk having their response to this RFP deemed non-responsive by the County. Only written responses issued by addendum to this RFP should be considered by the Proposers.

During the period provided for the preparation of Proposals, the County may issue addenda to this RFP. These addenda will be numbered consecutively and will be posted on the Fulton County website, [www.fultoncountyga.gov](http://www.fultoncountyga.gov). These addenda will be issued by, or on behalf of, the County and will constitute a part of this RFP. Each Proposer is required to acknowledge receipt of each addendum by submitting an executed acknowledgment form. This acknowledgment shall include all addenda distributed prior to the Proposal Submission Date. All responses to this RFP shall be prepared with full consideration of the addenda issued prior to the Proposal Submission Date.

## **2.5 TERM OF CONTRACT**

The period of this Agreement shall consist of a series of Terms as defined below. The County is obligated only to pay such compensation under this Agreement as may lawfully be made from funds budgeted and appropriated for that purpose during the County's then current fiscal year.

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**a. Commencement Term**

The “Commencement Term” of this Agreement shall begin on the date of execution of the Agreement in the year 2011, the starting date, and shall end absolutely and without further obligation on the part of the County on the 31<sup>st</sup> day of December, 2011. The Commencement Term shall be subject to events of termination and the County’s termination rights that are described elsewhere in this Agreement. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Agreement, the County’s obligation to make payments provided under this Agreement shall be subject to the County’s annual appropriations of funds for the goods, services, materials, property and/or supplies procured under this Agreement by the County’s governing body and such obligation shall not constitute a pledge of the County’s full faith and credit within the meaning of any constitutional debt limitation.

**b. Renewal Terms**

Unless the terms of this Agreement are fulfilled with no further obligation of the part of either party on or before the final date of the Commencement Term as stated above, or unless an event of termination as defined within this Agreement occurs during the Commencement Term, this Agreement may be renewed at the written option of the County upon the approval of the County Board of Commissioners for four (4) one-year (“Renewal Terms”). However, no Renewal Term of this Agreement shall be authorized nor shall any Renewal Term of this Agreement commence unless and until each Renewal Term has first been approved in writing by the County Board of Commissioners for the calendar year of such Renewal Term. If approved by the County Board of Commissioners, the First Renewal Term shall begin on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January, 2012 and shall end no later than the 31<sup>st</sup> day of December, 2012. If approved by the County Board of Commissioners, the Second Renewal Term shall begin on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January, 2013 and shall end no later than the 31<sup>st</sup> day of December, 2013. If approved by the County Board of Commissioners, the Third Renewal Term shall begin on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January, 2014 and shall end no later than the 31<sup>st</sup> day of December, 2014. If approved by the County Board of Commissioners, the Fourth Renewal Term shall begin on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January, 2015 and shall end no later than the 31<sup>st</sup> day of December, 2015. If the County chooses not to exercise any Renewal Term as provided in this Section, then the Term of this Agreement then in effect shall also be deemed the “Ending Term” with no further obligation on the party of either party.

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**c. Term Subject to Events of Termination**

All “Terms” as defined within this Section are subject to the section of this Agreement which pertain to events of termination and the County’s rights upon termination.

**d. Same Terms**

Unless mutually agreed upon in writing by the parties, or otherwise indicated herein, all provisions and conditions of any Renewal Term shall be exactly the same as those contained within in this Agreement.

**e. Statutory Compliance Regarding Purchase Contracts.**

The parties intend that this Agreement shall, and this Agreement shall operate in conformity with and not in contravention of the requirements of O.C.G.A. § 36-60-13, as applicable, and in the event that this Agreement would conflict therewith, then this Agreement shall be interpreted and implemented in a manner consistent with such statute.

**2.6 REQUIRED SUBMITTALS**

See **Exhibit 1** for the Required Submittal Checklist. This checklist will assist you to ensure that all required submittals are submitted. Failure to submit all required submittals may deem your proposal non-responsive.

**2.7 PROPOSAL EVALUATION**

All proposals will be evaluated using the criteria specified in Section 4 of this RFP. Selection will include an analysis of proposals by a Vendor Selection Committee composed of County personnel who will review the proposal submittals in accordance with the submittal requirements and the evaluation criteria set forth in Section 4 of this RFP. Each Service Delivery Area option will be evaluated in accordance with the criteria and procedures described in Sections 3 and 4 of this RFP. The County will award each Service Delivery Area option to the most advantageous proposer(s) based on the cost and the evaluation factors set forth in the RFP. The committee may request oral interviews and/or site visits.

**2.8 DISQUALIFICATION OF PROPOSERS**

The submission of more than one (1) proposal to the County as the primary Proposer or member of a joint venture for the same work by and individual firm, partnership or corporation under the same or different names may be considered as sufficient for disqualification of a Proposer and the rejection of the proposal.

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## **2.9 RESERVED RIGHTS**

The County reserves the right to accept or reject any and/or all proposals, to waive irregularities and technicalities, and to request resubmission. Any sole response that is received may or may not be rejected by the County depending on available competition and timely needs of the County. There is no obligation on the part of the County to award the contract to the lowest proposer and the County reserves the right to award the contract to the responsible proposers submitting responsive proposals with resulting agreements most advantageous and in the best interest of the County. The County shall be the sole judge of the proposals and the resulting agreements that are in its best interest and its decision shall be final. Also, the County reserves the right to make such investigation as it deems necessary to determine the ability of any proposer to perform the work or service requested. Information the County deems necessary to make this determination shall be provided by the proposer. Such information may include, but shall not be limited to, current financial statements by an independent CPA; verification of availability of personnel; and past performance records.

## **2.10 APPLICABLE LAWS**

All applicable laws and regulations of the State of Georgia and ordinances and regulations of Fulton County shall apply. Protestors shall seek resolution of their complaints in the manner provided in the Fulton County Code of Laws §2-324 which is incorporated by reference herein.

## **2.11 MINIMUM PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS FOR PRIME CONTRACTORS**

Pursuant to Fulton County Code 102-357, Prime Bidders on the project must perform no less than 51% of the scope of work required under the project.

## **2.12 INSURANCE AND RISK MANAGEMENT PROVISIONS**

Insurance and Risk Management provisions and Indemnification and Hold Harmless provisions are outlined in Section 7 of this RFP.

## **2.13 ACCURACY OF RFP AND RELATED DOCUMENTS**

The County assumes no responsibility that the specified technical and background information presented in this RFP, or otherwise distributed or made available during this procurement process, is complete or accurate. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the County will not be bound by or be responsible for any explanation or interpretation of the

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Proposal documents other than those given in writing as an addendum to this RFP.

Should a recipient of this RFP find discrepancies in or omissions from this RFP and related documents, the recipient of this RFP shall immediately notify the Purchasing Contact Person identified in Section 1.11 in writing at the following address: Fulton County Department of Purchasing and Contract Compliance, Public Safety Bldg, 130 Peachtree Street S.W., Suite 1168 Atlanta, GA 30303. A written addendum, if necessary, then will be made available to each recipient of this RFP.

#### **2.14 RESPONSIBILITY OF PROPOSER**

Each Proposer is encouraged to conduct all necessary investigations and review all available and relevant data and information, which are necessary in its judgment in order to assume this responsibility prior to the submittal of its Proposal. Proposers are reminded of Fulton County's "**No Contact During Procurement**" policy and may only contact the person designated by the RFP.

#### **2.15 CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION**

If any Proposal contains technical, financial, or other confidential information that the Proposer believes is exempt from disclosure, the Proposer must clearly label the specific portions sought to be kept confidential and specify on what the exemption is based. The County, at its sole discretion and subject to applicable law, will determine whether such exemption applies. The County has sole discretion to make such determination regarding the disclosure of information, and by responding to this RFP, Proposers waive any challenge to the County's decisions in this regard. Marking all or substantially all of a Proposal as confidential may result in the Proposer being deemed non-responsive to this RFP.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, Proposers recognize and agree that the County, its staff, and its Consultants will not be responsible or liable in any way for any losses that the Proposer may suffer from the disclosure of information or materials to third parties.

#### **2.16 COUNTY RIGHTS AND OPTIONS**

This RFP constitutes an invitation to submit Proposals to the County. Without limitation or penalty, the County reserves and holds at its sole discretion, the following rights and options:

- This RFP does not obligate the County to select, procure or contract for any services whatsoever

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- The County reserves the right to change or alter the schedule for any events associated with this procurement and, if required, notify the Proposers. A Proposer, by submitting a Proposal, agrees to be bound by any modifications made by the County
  - All costs incurred by a Proposer in connection with responding to this RFP, the evaluation and selection process undertaken in connection with this procurement, and any negotiations with the County will be borne by the Proposer.
  - The County reserves the right to reject all Proposals and components thereof to eliminate all Proposers responding to this RFP from further consideration for this procurement, and to notify such Proposers of the County's determination.
  - The County may cancel this RFP without the substitution of another RFP and terminate this procurement at any time without any liability whatsoever.
  - The County reserves the right to waive any technicalities or irregularities in the Proposals.
  - The County reserves the right to eliminate any Proposer who submits incomplete or inadequate responses or is not responsive to the requirements of this RFP.
  - The County may request Proposers to send representatives to the County for interviews and presentations.
  - To the extent deemed appropriate by the County, the County may select and enter into discussion and negotiations with the Proposer(s) submitting Proposal(s), which are found to be reasonably susceptible for award.
  - The County reserves the right to discontinue negotiations with any selected Proposer.
  - The County reserves the right, without prior notice, to supplement, amend, or otherwise modify this RFP.
  - All Proposals (other than portions thereof subject to patent or copyright protection) become the property of the County and will not be returned, and the County reserves the right to utilize all such information contained in the Proposals without further cost to the County.

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- The County may add to or delete from the Project Scope of Work set forth in this RFP.
  - Any and all Proposals not received by the Proposal Submission Date shall be rejected and returned unopened.
  - Neither the County, its staff, its representatives, nor any of its consultants or attorneys will be liable for any claims or damages resulting from the solicitation, collection, review, or evaluation of responses to this RFP.
  - The County, including its representatives and consultants, reserves the right to visit and examine any of the facilities referenced in any Proposal and to observe and investigate the operations of such facilities.
  - The County reserves the right to conduct investigations of the Proposers and their responses to this RFP and to request additional evidence to support the information included in any such response.

By responding to this RFP, Proposers acknowledge and consent to the rights and conditions set forth in this RFP.

## **2.17 COST OF PROPOSAL PREPARATION AND SELECTION PROCESS**

Each Proposal, including preparation of all information required to be included in a Proposal pursuant to this RFP, shall be prepared at the sole cost and expense (including, but not limited to, engineering and legal costs) of the Proposer. In addition, the Proposer shall be solely responsible for all costs (including engineering and legal costs) incurred by such Proposer in connection with this selection process, including any costs incurred by the Proposer in any subsequent negotiations entered into in connection with developing the Proposal. There shall be no claims whatsoever against the County, its staff, or its consultants for reimbursement for the costs or expenses (including, but not limited to, engineering and legal costs) incurred during the preparation of the Proposal or other information required by this RFP or procurement process or in connection with the selection process or any negotiations.

## **2.18 TERMINATION OF NEGOTIATIONS**

The County at its sole discretion may, at any time, to the extent permitted by Applicable Law, exclude a Proposer from further participation in any

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negotiation process if the County determines that such Proposer is failing to progress in the negotiations or if the terms of its Proposal are less advantageous than those of other Proposers and such Proposer is deemed to be no longer susceptible of selection. The County will give written notice of its decision to the Proposer, which shall be sent in writing, signed by the County.

## **2.19 WAGE CLAUSE**

Pursuant to 102-391, Each Contractor shall agree that in the performance of the Contract he will comply with all lawful agreements, if any, which the Contractor had made with any association, union, or other entity, with respect to wages, salaries, and working conditions, so as not to cause inconvenience, picketing, or work stoppage.

## **2.20 ADDITIONAL OR SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION**

After receipt of the submittals, the County will evaluate the responses, including the references, financial statements, experience and other data relating to the Respondent's qualifications. If requested by the Fulton County Department of Purchasing and Contract Compliance, Respondent's may required to submit additional or supplemental information to determine whether the Respondent meets all of the qualification requirements.

## **2.21 REPORTING RESPONSIBILITIES**

The successful Proposer will report directly to the Office of Aging Program Manager, or designated representative as assigned by the Director of Housing and Human Services.

## **2.22 GEORGIA SECURITY AND IMMIGRATION COMPLIANCE ACT**

This Request for Proposal is subject to the Georgia Security & Immigration Compliance Act. Pursuant to the Georgia Security & Immigration Compliance Act of 2006, as amended on May 11, 2009, bidders and proposers are notified that all bids/proposals for services that are to be physically performed within the State of Georgia must be accompanied by proof of their registration with and continuing and future participation in the E-Verify program established by the United States Department of Homeland Security. A completed affidavit must be submitted on the top of the bid/proposal at the time of submission, prior to the time for opening bids/proposals. Under state law, the County cannot consider any bid/proposal which does not include a completed affidavit. It is not the intent of this notice to provide detailed information or legal advice concerning the Georgia Security & Immigration Compliance Act. All bidders/proposers intending to do business with the County are

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responsible for independently apprising themselves and complying with the requirements of that law and its effect on County procurements and their participation in those procurements. ## **2.23 AUTHORIZATION TO TRANSACT BUSINESS**

If the Proposer is a Georgia corporation, the corporation, prior to contract execution, shall submit documentary evidence from the Secretary of State that the Corporation is in good standing and that the corporation is authorized to transact business in the State of Georgia.

If the Proposer is a foreign (non-Georgia) corporation, the corporation, prior to contract execution shall submit a Certificate of Authority and documentary evidence from the Georgia Secretary of State of good standing which reflects that the corporation is authorized to do business in the State of Georgia.

## **2.24 RIGHT TO PROTEST**

Any actual bidder or Proposer who is aggrieved in connection with the solicitation or award of a contract shall protest in writing to the Director of Purchasing & Contract Compliance. An actual bidder or Proposer is defined as a person or entity who has submitted a bid or proposal on the project for which they are filing a protest. A protest shall be submitted to and received by the Director of Purchasing & Contract Compliance in writing within 14 days after such aggrieved entity known or should have known of the solicitation, the award of contract to another or other acts giving rise to a protest. An oral protest or a protest to an official, employee, User Department, or other person apart from the Director of Purchasing & Contract Compliance does not comply.

## **2.25 FIRST SOURCE JOBS POLICY**

It is the policy of Fulton County Government to provide employment opportunities to the citizens of Fulton County. This policy will apply to all contracts procured through the Department of Purchasing & Contract Compliance valued in excess of \$200,000. The Prime Contract is expected to utilize the First Source Jobs Program to fill 50% of the entry level jobs which arise as a result of any project funded in whole or in part with County funds with residents of Fulton County. Forms are provided in Section 6 of this RFP.

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## 2.26 GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

The following information pertains to the submission of a proposal to Fulton County ("County"), and contains instructions on how proposals must be presented in order to be considered. If specific conditions or instructions in the text of the Request for Proposal ("RFP") conflict with the General Requirements as listed here, those conditions or instructions in the RFP shall prevail.

1. Proposals submitted in response to the attached RFP must be formatted as specified in the RFP. Additional sheets, literature, etc., should be clearly identified.
2. The original and the required number of copies of the proposal must be returned to:

3. The envelope in which the proposal is submitted must be sealed and clearly labeled with the RFP project name and number, due date and time, and the name of the company or individual submitting the proposal. Proposals must be received by the opening date and time shown on this RFP in order to be considered. The Purchasing Agent has no obligation to consider proposals which are not in properly marked envelopes. The Technical Proposal, Cost Proposal and Contract Compliance submittals shall be submitted in separate sealed envelopes. The inclusion of any cost information in the Technical Proposal may result in such proposal being rejected by the County.
4. Proposals received after the time and date specified will not be opened or considered.
5. By submitting a signed proposal, Proposer agrees to accept an award made as a result of the submission of the prices and terms contained in that proposal. Prices proposed must be audited by the Proposer to insure correctness before the proposal is submitted. Person signing the proposal is responsible for the accuracy of information in it. The specifications, provisions, and the terms and conditions of the RFP and proposal shall become a valid contract between Fulton County and the Proposer upon notice of award of contract in writing and/or issuance of a purchase order.

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6. Any contract awarded as a result of this proposal, shall comply fully with all Local, State, and Federal laws and regulations.
  7. Absolutely no fax proposals or reproduction proposals will be accepted, except that if multiple copies of the proposal are required, photocopies of the original may be submitted as the additional copies, provided that they are clearly marked as such.
  8. Type or neatly print company name, as well as the full legal name and title of the person signing the proposal, in all appropriate places. The Proposer's signature must be executed by a Principal of the company duly authorized to make contracts and bind the company to all terms being proposed.
  9. Proposals may be withdrawn upon receipt of a written request prior to the stated due date and time. If a firm seeks to withdraw a proposal after the due date and time, the firm must present a notarized statement indicating that an error was made, with an explanation of how it occurred. The withdrawal request must be accompanied by documentation supporting the claim. Prior to approving or disapproving the request, an opinion will be obtained from Fulton County's Legal Counsel indicating whether the firm is bound by its proposal.

Proposals for projects that are solicited pursuant to the Georgia Local Government Public Works Construction Law (O.C.G.A. § 36-91-1 et seq.) may be withdrawn as follows:

The County must advise Proposers in the request for proposals of the number of days that Proposers will be required to honor their proposals. If an Proposer is not selected within 60 days of opening the proposals, any Proposer that is determined by the governmental entity to be unlikely of being selected for contract award will be released from the proposal.

10. Show information and prices in the format requested. Prices are to be quoted F.O.B. destination, and must include all costs chargeable to the Proposer in executing the contract, including taxes. Unless otherwise provided in the Contract, Fulton County shall have no liability for any cost not included in the price. The Proposer shall provide Fulton County the benefit through a reduction in price of any decrease in the Proposer's costs by reason of tax exemptions based upon Fulton County's status as a tax-exempt entity.
11. Propose all items specified or indicate under each item what alternative is being proposed and why it should be considered in lieu of the original specification. Failures to indicate any exceptions shall

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be interpreted as the Proposer's intent to fully comply with the specifications as written. Conditional or qualified proposals (except as specifically allowed in the specifications) are subject to rejection in whole or in part.

12. Fulton County shall be the sole judge of the quality and the applicability of all proposals. Design, features, overall quality, local facilities, terms and other pertinent considerations will be taken into account in determining acceptability.
13. The successful Proposer must assume full responsibility for delivery of all goods and services proposed and agree to relieve Fulton County of all responsibility and costs for prosecuting claims.
14. The successful Proposer must assume full responsibility for replacement of all defective or damaged goods and/or performance of contracted services within thirty (30) days notice by the County of such defect, damage or deficiency.
15. The successful Proposer must assume full responsibility for providing warranty service on all goods, materials, or equipment provided to the County with warranty coverage. Should a vendor be other than the manufacturer, the vendor and not the County is responsible for contacting the manufacturer. The Proposer is solely responsible for arranging for the service to be performed.
16. The successful Proposer shall be responsible for the proper training and certification of personnel used in the performance of the services proposed.
17. The successful Proposer shall not assign, transfer, convey, sublet, or otherwise dispose of any contract resulting from the RFP or of any of all of its rights, title or interest therein without prior written consent of the Fulton County Board of Commissioners.
18. Proposals must contain references which reflect successful completion of contracts for the types of goods, materials, equipment, or services for which the vendor is submitting a proposal to the County. In instances where that does not apply, the proposal must contain a statement and supporting documentation demonstrating such expertise, knowledge, or experience to establish the vendor submitting the proposal as capable of meeting the demands of the proposal should an award be made to them.
19. Proposers submitting proposals may be required to furnish evidence that they maintain permanent places of business of a type and nature

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compatible with their proposal, and are in all respects competent and eligible vendors, able to fulfill the terms of the specifications. Fulton County may make such investigations as it deems necessary to determine the ability of the Proposer to perform such work, and reserves the right to reject any proposal if evidence fails to indicate that the proposed vendor is qualified to carry out the obligation of the contract and to complete the work satisfactorily.

20. By submitting a signed proposal, Proposer certifies that there has been no collusion with any other Proposer. Reasonable grounds for believing Proposer has an interest in more than one proposal will result in rejection of all proposals in which the Proposer has an interest. Any party to collusion may not be considered in future proposals for the same or similar work.
21. Upon notice of selection, the Proposer submitting the proposal is obligated to perform. Should a successful Proposer refuse to enter into a contract subsequent to an award, a penalty may be assessed and/or the Proposer may be found to be “non-responsible” in the future.
22. In case of default by the successful Proposer, Fulton County may procure the articles or services from another source and hold the successful Vendor responsible for any resultant excess cost.
23. Successful Proposers contract directly with the County and are the party or parties obligated to perform. Contracts may not be assigned and any failure to perform the Contract in accordance with the specifications will constitute a breach of contract and may result in an Proposer being found to be “non-responsible” in the future.
24. Invoice(s) must list each item separately and must show Fulton County’s purchase order number as well as the proper department and address to whom the service or product was provided.
25. Fulton County reserves the right to accept or reject any or all proposals, or any part thereof, and to waive any technicalities. Fulton County reserves the right to award a contract based on this RFP and the proposal(s) received (in whole or in part) to one or several Vendors.
26. Awards will not necessarily be based on cost alone. Other factors, as detailed in the RFP, will be considered in determining what proposal will be deemed to best meet the needs of Fulton County.

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27. All proposals and bids submitted to Fulton County are subject to the Georgia “Open Records Act”, Official Code of Georgia, Annotated (O.C.G.A.) § 50-18-70 et seq.
  28. All proposals and bids submitted to Fulton County involving Utility Contracting are subject to the Georgia law governing licensing of Utility Contractors, O.C.G.A. §43-14-8.2(h). The Utility Contractor License number of the person who will perform the utility work shall be written on the face of the bid envelope.
  29. Prior to beginning any work, the successful Proposer shall furnish to Fulton County (for the contracting firm and for any subcontractors) a certificate from an insurance company showing issuance of Workers’ compensation coverage for the State of Georgia or a certificated from the Georgia Workers’ Compensation Board showing proof of ability to pay compensation directly.
  30. It is the policy of Fulton County that the evaluation and award process for County contracts shall be free from both actual and perceived impropriety, and that contacts between potential vendors and County officials, elected officials and staff regarding pending awards of County contracts shall be prohibited.
    - A. No person, firm, or business entity, however situated or composed, obtaining a copy of or responding to this solicitation, shall initiate or continue any verbal or written communication regarding this solicitation with any County officer, elected official, employee, or designated County representative, between the date of the issuance of this solicitation and the date of the County Manager’s recommendation to the Board of Commissioners for award of the subject contract, except as may otherwise be specifically authorized and permitted by the terms and conditions of this solicitation.
    - B. All verbal and written communications initiated by such person, firm, or entity regarding this solicitation, if same are authorized and permitted by the terms and conditions of this solicitation, shall be directed to the Purchasing Agent.
    - C. Any violation of this prohibition of the initiation or continuation of verbal or written communications with County officers, elected officials, employees, or designated County representatives shall result in a written finding by the Purchasing Agent that the submitted bid or proposal of the person, firm, or entity in violation is “non-responsive”, and same shall not be considered for award.

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31. Any Proposer intending to respond to this solicitation as a Joint Venture must submit an executed Joint Venture Agreement with this offer. This agreement must designate those persons or entities authorized to execute documents or otherwise bind the Joint Venture in all transactions with Fulton County, or be accompanied by a document, binding upon the Joint Venture and its constituent members, making such designation. Offers from Joint Ventures that do not include these documents will be rejected as being “non-responsive”.
  32. Any Proposer intending to respond to this solicitation must complete all of the Procurement Affidavit Forms provided in Section 5. Proposals that do not include these completed documents will be rejected as being “non-responsive”.

**3.1 SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS**

**3.1.1 Proposal Submission Date and Submittal Format**

The Proposal shall consist of a Technical Proposal, a Cost Proposal and all documents listed on the Required Submittal Checklist (Exhibit 1). The Technical Proposal shall include proposer information, technical information, business-related information, and any Technical Proposal forms requested. The Cost Proposal shall include the Cost Proposal Forms and any information describing the basis for pricing and must be separately, sealed, marked and packaged.

The required content of the Technical Proposal and Cost Proposal is further specified in this section of the RFP. The Proposal must be signed and acknowledged by the Proposer, including certain information to be provided under oath as required under applicable law, in accordance with the instructions herein and the various proposal forms.

**THE TECHNICAL PROPOSAL, THE COST PROPOSAL AND CONTRACT COMPLIANCE EXHIBITS SHALL BE SUBMITTED IN SEPARATE, SEALED ENVELOPES OR PACKAGES. THE INCLUSION OF ANY COST INFORMATION IN THE TECHNICAL PROPOSAL MAY RESULT IN SUCH PROPOSAL BEING REJECTED BY THE COUNTY.**

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### 3.1.2 Number of Copies

Proposers shall submit the following:

Technical Proposal, one (1) original and five (5) copies on CD media in PDF format.

Contract Compliance Exhibits, one (1) original with the Technical Proposal marked "Original" and one (1) copy in a separate sealed envelope.

Financial Information, one (1) original with the Technical Proposal marked "Original" and one (1) copy in a separate sealed envelope.

Cost Proposal, one (1) original and five (5) copies in a separate sealed envelope.

All Proposals must be complete with all requested information.

## 3.2 OVERVIEW OF PROPOSAL REQUIREMENTS

Proposers shall submit Proposals in accordance with the content and format requirements set forth in this RFP. Proposals should be clearly organized and structured in a manner that allows materials included in the document to be located easily.

Each of the instructions set forth in this section must be followed for a Proposal to be deemed responsive to this RFP. In all cases, the County reserves the right to determine, at its sole discretion, whether any aspect of the Proposal meets the requirements set forth in this section. The County reserves the right to reject any Proposal, which in its judgment, does not comply with these Proposal submission requirements.

## 3.3 SCOPE OF WORK

The Fulton County Office of Aging manages the Human Services Transportation services for seniors and the developmentally disabled. The following outlines a description of services, passengers, and service delivery standards required for the provision of services.

### A. Description of Services

**Core Hour Trips** - Core hours are those trips provided during Monday – Friday 6:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m.

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Facility Transportation: Transport of participants of fifteen (15) Neighborhood Senior Centers, five (5) Adult Day Programs and three (3) County Training Centers for the Developmentally Disabled. See Appendix A for names, locations, and operating hours these facilities. Transport from a consumer's home to a center will constitute one trip, transport back to the consumer's home will constitute another trip. Trips are scheduled weekly. Trip reservations are submitted on Thursday for the week (Monday through Friday) following the submission.

Adult Day Care transportation is scheduled according to the assessed needs of the participants and their caregivers. Please note that adult day participants arrive at the center based on their assessed needs, they do not all arrive at the center or depart from the center at the same time.

Group Trip Services: Trips provided to a group of registered center participants, originating from one point and transported as a group to another point. This service is available to the facilities listed in Attachment A. This service includes trips for recreation, shopping and community meetings from the Neighborhood Senior Centers and the Training Centers for the Developmentally Disabled.

Demand Response Trips: This service is available seniors who are certified for the service by Care Managers of one of the three Care Management agencies contracting with the Fulton County Human Services Department/Office of Aging Division for transportation to and from medical appointments and; Consumers of the Supported Employment Program for trips from their home to and from their place of employment. Trips requests will be forward to successful vendors on a rotating basis by the Office of Aging Transportation staff. Vendors must accept or decline the trips within four (4) hours. Trips not accepted within four (4) hours will be considered declined and forwarded to the next successful Proposer in the rotation. The nature of these trips will be predominately for non-emergency medical appointments. Excessive lateness or complaints may result in removal from the rotation.

Subscription Trips: Many non-emergency medical trips can be set-up on a routine schedule, or subscription trip. The routine schedule will be established with the successful Proposer. The successful Proposer will continue to perform the trips on the subscription schedule until notified of changes or cancelation by the Office of Aging Transportation staff. These trips will consist predominantly as routine medical therapy treatment, such as dialysis or chemotherapy.

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Transport from a senior's home to the medical appointment/treatment constitutes one trip. The return trip from the medical appointment/treatment to the senior's home will constitute another trip.

**B. Non-Core Hour Trips** – Trips in this category consist of group trips for special events outside the normal operating hours of the centers to include, but not limited to:

1. Shuttle Service for overflow parking at evening and weekend events
2. Evening or weekend trips to a theater or special event (These could originate at individual homes, much like Subscription Service, or at a center, similar to Group Charter Services.)
3. Special Meetings involving seniors and/or senior issues

**C. Description of Passengers**

Neighborhood Senior Centers: Passengers at the Neighborhood Senior Centers will include seniors, age sixty (60) and older, average age is seven-four (74), who are residents of Fulton County and registered as a participant of a Neighborhood Senior Center. Most seniors will be self-sufficient; however, some may have assistive devices of wheelchairs that must be secured during transport. Drivers should offer assistance to passengers getting on and off the bus. Center Managers will certify customers for services. Contact with the transportation provider will consist of a Transportation Eligibility Form, which will require a confirmation of start date from the transportation provider.

Adult Day Care Facilities: Passengers to the Adult Day Care Facilities will fifty-five (55) years old or older. These clients may suffer from mild dementia and/or may have physical disabilities and may require assistance getting on and off the buses. The Adult Day Program Coordinator will certify passengers for service. Notification to the transportation provider will be through a Transportation Eligibility Form, which will require a confirmation of start date from the transportation provider.

One Bus Monitor per route is required on all Training Center routes. The Bus Monitors must be trained in CPR, First Aid and participate in Bus Monitor training conducted by the Adult Day Care Centers.

Training Centers for the Developmentally Disabled: Passengers will consist of registered consumers of the three Training Centers. Consumers will have Developmental Disabilities, which may include

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physical disabilities. The Center Directors certify consumers for transportation services. Notification to the transportation provider will consist of a Transportation Eligibility Form, which will require a confirmation of start date from the transportation provider.

One Bus Monitor per route is required on all Training Center routes. The Bus Monitors must be trained in CPR, First Aid and participate in Bus Monitor training conducted by the Training Centers.

Schedule Response Service: Passengers will include seniors age 60 and older who are certified for Medical Transportation by a Care Manager from one of the three Care Management agencies contracting with the Fulton County Human Services Department/Office of Aging Division. Notification to the transportation provider will be through a Trip Request from the Office of Aging Transportation staff. Fulton County staff will confirm eligibility.

Some passengers may require an escort to assist them once they arrive at the medical appointment. The Care Manager will determine which passengers require escorts, and will note that requirement in the passenger's record. The service provider will be notified that a passenger has an escort accompanying them when booking a trip for the passenger.

#### **D. Service Delivery Standards**

**General Standards** - The Proposers must assure that transportation services are provided which comply with the following minimum service delivery requirements and which shall be delineated in all transportation service agreements:

1. The successful Proposer will maintain basic consumer profile information on each Facility Transportation service passenger on the vehicle transporting that passenger for reference in case of an emergency, and be immediately accessible through dispatch. Consumer profiles may include levels of supervision and/or assistance for each consumer.
2. Clients being transported that are designated by the Health and Human Service programs as requiring high levels of supervision shall not be left at destination points without the supervision of an adult. In the event that no adult is present at the point of destination or alternate destination listed to receive such a passenger, the driver will radio the dispatcher and the dispatcher will begin efforts to locate the passenger's appointed

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supervisor/case worker. If the appointed supervisor cannot be located by telephone, the human service provider that ordered the service will be contacted immediately and the driver will deliver the passenger to the designated adult at the human service program who ordered service upon completion of the route, unless a written alternative plan is mutually agreed upon by the Provider and the Office of Aging.

3. The successful Proposer shall comply with Fulton County policies with regard to confidentiality.
4. The Proposer shall inform the appropriate Health and Human service program representative of any difficulties experienced in transporting a Health and Human service provider consumer, whether related to safety, behavior, or other reason.
5. The Proposer shall summarize the daily logs maintained by drivers and report requested information to the Fulton County Human Services Transportation Coordinator monthly.
6. Transportation shall be provided to participating consumers without the collection of any co-payment.
7. The Proposers will provide sufficient resources (numbers and types of vehicles and drivers) to provide services under this RFP.
8. Transportation providers must meet registration requirements of the Georgia Public Service Commission to provide transportation services, and maintain an active valid registration throughout the term of the contract.
9. Proposers must operate with a maximum level of coordination/consolidation with other transportation providers and/or systems operating within the county, or a portion thereof.
10. Successful Proposers may be required to communicate trip information through an automated system chosen by Fulton County.

Proposer should describe in detail how they plan to provide the services outlined in 1 through 10 above in the Detailed Work Plan.

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## **E. Driver Standards**

All drivers utilized to deliver transportation services to Health and Human Services program participants must meet the minimum standards outlined in the in the State of Georgia, Department of Human Services (“DHS”) Transportation Manual which can be found on DHS website

Successful Proposer(s) must outline a detailed plan describing their strategy to recruit and retain drivers that meet the standards outline in the DHS Transportation Manual in the Detailed Work Plan Section of your response.

## **F. Staff Training**

Top quality customer service is a key objective in this project. To provide top quality customer service staff training and refresher courses are paramount.

All drivers utilized to deliver transportation services to Health and Human Services program participants must have successfully completed the following training requirements:

1. General Orientation
2. Consumer Service/Courtesy Training
3. Sensitivity Awareness specific to Seniors and Developmentally Disabled populations
4. Driver Conduct
5. Vehicle Orientation, Pre-Trip inspections
6. A Certified Defensive Driving Course
7. Proper Handling and Securing of Mobility Aids
8. Record Keeping Requirements
9. Emergency Procedures
10. A Certified Basic First Aid & CPR Course (current certification must be maintained)

Additional courses and refresher modules should be provided as necessary to ensure quality service delivery. All training materials should be updated periodically to reflect changes in policy and revised or new procedures.

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Successful Proposer(s) must outline a detailed plan describing their strategy to provide the required training, including a schedule of refresher modules in the Detailed Work Plan Section of your response.

## **G. Vehicle Requirements**

All vehicles utilized in the performance of transportation services through this solicitation must meet the requirements outlined in the DHS Transportation and Risk Management Manuals which can be found at DHS website,

Standard seven (7) and/or fifteen (15) passenger vehicles (passenger vans) are not permitted for use in Facility Transportation Services. Those used for non-emergency medical transportation services must be in compliance with Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA); and all vehicles must have (2) two-way radios assigned to each vehicle and properly identified with company seal and/or logo.

Vehicles and all components must comply with or exceed the manufacturer's state and federal, safety and mechanical operating and maintenance standards for the particular vehicles and models used under this contract. This requirement includes adherence to the manufacturers' recommended maintenance schedule with documentation to support adherence to the schedule. Documentation must also be available for periodic desk audits.

The General Services Department, Transportation and Logistics Division is responsible for establishing a inspection schedule; conducting routine maintenance inspections; establishing vehicle standards; determining whether vehicle(s) are deemed unsafe and making the recommendation that vehicle(s) should be removed from the fleet.

Vehicles must comply with all applicable federal laws including ADA regulations. Any vehicle found non-compliant with Georgia Department of Motor Vehicle Safety (DMVS) licensing requirements, safety standards, Public Service Commission, ADA regulations, or RFP requirements must be removed from service immediately.

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## H. Vehicle Mileage and Age Standards

To ensure reliability of the services, and the safety and comfort of the passengers, vehicles that exceed the following standards cannot be used to provide the services outlined in this Request for Proposals.

- **Passenger Van – F250 Models (or equivalent) 5 years or older**

These vehicles do not include a dual rear wheel. Seating capacity will range from 10 to 12 passengers and the weight of this vehicle places a strain on the drive train. Use must be limited to 175,000 miles.

- **Cutaway (Small) –F350 Models (or equivalent) 5 years or older**

These vehicles are more durable than the F250 and usually include dual rear wheels. Seating capacity will range from 10 to 15 passengers and the weight of this vehicle places a strain on the drive chain. Use must be limited to 200,000 miles.

- **Cutaway (Medium) – F450 (or equivalent) Models 7 years or older**

These bus cabins sit on a larger Ford Truck model, typically an F450 (or E), and it has a higher performance expectation. They're powered by larger diesel engines with heavier suspension and braking systems. Seating capacity will range from 15 to 25. Use must be limited to 225,000 miles.

**Vehicles that do not meet these specifications should not appear on Appendix B – List of Proposed Vehicles.**

## I. Vehicle Maintenance/Repair

Proposers must submit a detailed schedule for the maintenance and repair of vehicles.

## J. Replacement and/or Acquisition Schedule

Proposers must submit a detailed plan and timeline for the acquisition of new/used vehicles (Capital Spending Plan) during the one (1) year contract period which includes four (4) options for renewals under this RFP. Fulton County will not provide any vehicles.

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## **K. Vehicle/Personnel Back-up Plans**

Proposers must submit a detailed work plan to demonstrate its strategy for replacement, with minimum delay, vehicles and/or equipment that are in need of repair; and strategy for ensuring adequate personnel coverage when there is unexpected and/or planned personnel absence. Such plan is necessary because the Proposer shall be responsible for arranging for back-up vehicles and/or personnel when notified by a Health and Human Service program staff or consumer that a vehicle is excessively late, is otherwise unavailable for services, or when specifically requested by Fulton County staff. The vehicle is “excessively late” if it is thirty (30) minutes late in meeting its assigned schedule.

## **L. Parking/Office Space**

Proposer should describe, in detail, its strategy to maintain adequate parking space for vehicles, scheduling, and office space. Strategy should include:

1. The location in which Proposer will park vehicles utilized in performing the services listed in this RFP.
2. The procedure to ensure prompt response time when trip assignments are received.
3. The location of Proposer’s primary office space and any satellite offices/locations from which the services in this project will be performed.

## **M. Pick Up and Delivery Standards**

The successful Proposer must ensure that transportation service provided complies with the following minimum pick-up and delivery service requirements:

1. Fulton County’s standard expectation is that services be provided as scheduled. The vehicles must be on time for pick-up and delivery, unless there are extenuating circumstances beyond the Provider’s or driver’s control. A 20-minute pick-up and delivery window period will be allowed (10 minutes before pick up time and 10 minutes past pick up time). Notification must be given by the provider to the consumer and/or human service program in the event of unavoidable delays.

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2. Passengers will be expected to respond and begin boarding the bus within five (5) minutes of arrival, within the twenty (20) minute pick-up window.
  3. Vehicles will not be required to wait more than five (5) minutes within the twenty (20) pick-up window, if the passenger has not responded. However, the lack of response must be reported to Fulton County Transportation staff within fifteen (15) minutes after departure.
  4. The successful Proposer must ensure that consumers are transported to and from appointments on time. Delays must be reported to the Fulton County Transportation staff as they occur.
  5. Late arrival by more than 20 minutes will be reported to the dispatcher for the purpose of notifying the human service program and/or consumer of the late arrival. Provider must advise scheduled riders of alternate pick up arrangements when required. Excessive lateness will be at the expense of the provider.
  6. In multiple-load situations, the successful Proposer must ensure that no Health and Human Services program participant served under this RFP is forced to remain in the vehicle more than forty-five (45) minutes longer than the average travel time for direct transport from point of pick up to destination.
  7. The Provider will monitor trips to ensure that consumers are picked up and delivered timely.
  8. The successful Proposers, in conjunction with the Department and Fulton County Office of Aging, may provide transportation services by:
    - a. Negotiating service agreements with qualified transportation providers;
    - b. Entering into service agreements with federally funded or public transit, including not-for-profit agencies, transit authorities, and licensed common carriers; and
    - c. Providing tokens or passes to recipients to cover the fare for federally funded, established public, or private transit service which is available when the consumer has the physical and mental capacity to use such service.

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9. When determining the most appropriate mode of transportation for a consumer, a basic consideration must be the consumer's current level of mobility and functional independence. Modes other than public transportation must be used when the consumer is:
    - a. Able to travel independently but, due to a permanent or temporary debilitating physical or mental condition, cannot use the mass transit system.
    - b. Traveling to and from a location inaccessible by mass transit.

Regardless of the method or combination of methods used to provide transportation services, the successful Proposer(s) is responsible for managing, supervising and/or monitoring all transportation provided with funds received through this RFP.

10. Proposer must provide a detailed description of its strategy to avoid excessive lateness.
11. Transportation provider must have at least one (1) monitor per vehicle when transporting Training Center for the Developmentally Disabled and Adult Day Care participants.

Proposer must describe in detail how they plan to provide the services outlined in 1 through 11 above in the Detailed Work Plan.

## **N. Reporting**

Reports shall include, at a minimum, the following:

### Non-Routine Reports

1. Verbal reports on incidents/accidents within one hour of occurrence, or if the office is closed by 9:00 a.m. the next business day.
2. Written initial reports on incidents/accidents by the next business day and police reports within 5 business days.
3. All trips that are not accommodated must be reported to the Fulton County Transportation staff within fifteen (15) minutes of pick-up time.
4. Written responses to complaints within three (3) business days.
5. Other ad hoc reports, as requested by the Fulton County Transportation staff.

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## Monthly Reports

Regular Monthly Reports must include the following, in a form acceptable to Fulton County:

Summary of monthly records shall include:

1. Mileage
2. Revenue Hours
3. Type and number of trips
4. Unduplicated count of passengers transported
  - i. Ambulatory
  - ii. Wheelchair
  - iii. Escorted
5. Other data as may be required.
6. A summary of trips requested that the provider wasn't able to accommodate and the reasons why
7. A monthly summary of complaints and corrective actions taken

Billing information must be submitted by the 7<sup>th</sup> working day of the month.

Detailed daily trip information by service site to include, but not be limited to, service hours, mileage, trip information, number of passengers, pick-up and delivery times, purpose of trip, type of trip, average miles per trip, trip mileage ranges, complaint logs must be maintained by the successful Proposer(s) and made available to Fulton County staff, as requested.

Details of all reports, including report format and transmission method will be defined by Fulton County staff in conjunction with the successful Proposer. The County reserves the right to request additional ad hoc or periodic reports from the successful Proposer.

The Fulton County staff shall monitor the successful Proposers' performance under this contract by telephone contact, records review, customer satisfaction surveys, and other means. Fulton County staff may ride on trips to monitor service. Vehicles must be made available to Fulton County or its agent for inspection at any time. Fulton County will also review reports of complaints.

Proposer should describe how they plan to accurately complete and submit by the 7th business day of each month the various reports including the type of technology to be used to produce the reports.

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## N. Billing

Proposers must provide an hourly rate, based on revenue hours, for transportation services using the Cost Proposal Worksheet (Appendix C – Cost Proposal). A revenue hour will begin when the first passenger is picked-up and end when the last passenger is dropped-off. In general, buses running routes to and from facilities operate an average of five (5) hours per day. Each facility is allowed four (4) group trips per month. Group trips average about three (3) hours. Revenue hours will be billed in increments of fifteen (15) minutes, e.g.: 1.5 hours, 2.75 hours. Successful Proposers may round hours up to the next fifteen minute increment, e.g. an hour and five (5) minutes would be billed as 1.25 hours.

**Proposers must describe in detail their strategy for documenting revenue hours.**

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### 3.4 TECHNICAL PROPOSAL FORMAT AND CONTENT

The Technical Proposal shall include the appropriate and requested information in sufficient detail to demonstrate the Proposer's knowledge, skills and abilities to provide requested services.

The Technical Proposal shall be arranged and include content as described below:

#### ***Section 1 - Executive Summary***

The executive summary shall include the following information:

- Provide the legal name of the entity responding to this proposal.
- Provide the business type of the entity responding to this proposal (i.e. Joint Venture, Partnership, etc).
- Provide a description of the company structure.
- Include a brief statement of approach to the work, understanding of the project's goals and objectives and demonstrated understanding of the project's potential problems and concerns.

#### ***Section 2 – Detailed Work Plan***

1. Name, address and telephone number of one (1) individual to whom all future correspondence and/or communications will be directed.
2. The Detailed Work Plan must address the management approach in completing the work identified in Section 3.3 Scope of Work. Divide the response into the following sections:
  - General Standards
  - Driver Requirements
  - Staff Training
  - Vehicle Requirements
  - Vehicle Mileage and Age Standards
  - Vehicle Maintenance/Repair
  - Vehicle/Personnel Back-up Plans
  - Parking and Office Space
  - Pick-up and Delivery Standards
  - Reporting
  - Billing

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The Proposer must address all sub-points in each section of the Scope of Work.

3. Provide a list of vehicles currently in use by your agency. Use the table provided in Appendix B – List of Proposed Vehicles.

***Section 3 – Project Team Qualifications/ Qualifications of Key Personnel***

1. Provide resumes for each of the key personnel proposed for this project with specific emphasis on the Project Manager. Each resume should be limited to no more than three (3) pages per person.
2. All proposed key personnel must have at least a minimum of three (3) years work experience in the provision of transportation services, preferably Human Services Transportation.
3. The Project Manager must have a minimum of five (5) years experience in the provision of transportation services, preferably Human Services Transportation.
4. Provide an organizational chart that includes all key personnel. The chart should begin at least one level higher than the Project Manager, if applicable.

***Section 4 – Relevant Project Experience***

Provide a description of the types of services performed by the Proposer within the past five (5) years. Include the following:

- The name of the project, the owner, year performed and the project location.
- A description of the project.
- A reference, including a contact name, addresses and phone number. This reference should be the owner's staff member who was in charge of the project for the owner.

***Section 5 – Proposer Financial Information***

It is the policy of the County to conduct a review of a firm's financial responsibility in order to determine the firm's capability to successfully perform the work.

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If submitting as a Joint Venture, Partnership, Limited Liability Corporation or Limited Liability Partnership, the financials must be submitted for each entity that comprises the prime contractor.

The following documentation is required in order for the County to evaluate financial responsibility:

- (1) Provide audited financial statements for the last three (3) years, including income statements, balance sheets, and any changes in financial position.
- (2) The latest quarterly financial report and a description of any material changes in financial position since the last audited financial statement.
- (3) Proposer's most recent Dun & Bradstreet, Value Line Reports or other credit ratings/report.
- (4) Identify any evidence of access to a line or letter of credit.

**Section 6 - Availability of Key Personnel**

- (1) Percentage of time key personnel will spend on this project
- (2) Current workload of key personnel

**Section 7- Local Preference**

Local Preference is given to businesses that have a business location within the geographic boundaries of Fulton County. The term business location means that the business has a staffed, fixed, physical place of business located within Fulton County and has had the same for at least one (1) year prior to the date of the business' submission of its proposal or bid, as applicable and has had held a valid business license from Fulton County or a city located within Fulton County for the business at a fixed, physical, place of business, for at least one (1) year prior to the date of the business' submission of its proposal or bid as applicable.

In order to receive the Local Preference points of ten (10) points the Proposer must meet one (1) of the following criteria, provide supporting documentation as required and certify under oath that it is eligible to receive the local preference points by signing and submitting Form H, Local Preference Affidavit located in Section 5 of this RFP

The Proposer must indicate which one (1) of the following criteria they will utilize in order to receive local preference:

1. Business having a business location within the geographic boundaries of Fulton County.

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The following supporting documentation must be provided:

- Copy of occupational tax certificate (business license) form Fulton County or a city located within Fulton County, or;
  - Copy of a lease or rental agreement, or;
  - Proof of ownership interest in a location within the geographical boundaries of Fulton County.
2. Businesses where at least fifty-one percent (51%) of the owners of the business are residents of Fulton County but the business is located outside of Fulton County.

The following supporting documentation must be provided:

- Provide the residential address of the business owner(s).
3. Businesses where at least fifty-one percent (51%) of the employees of the business are residents of Fulton County but the business is located outside of Fulton County.

The following supporting documentation must be provided:

- Provide a list of all employees name and address.

Failure to provide the required supporting documentation with your proposal submittal shall result in your firm receiving a “0” (zero) for Local Preference. In the event the affidavit or other declaration under oath is determined to be false, such business shall be deemed “non-responsive” and shall not be considered for award of the applicable contract.

### ***Section 8 – Disclosure Form and Questionnaire***

It is the policy of Fulton County to review the history of litigation of each Proposer that includes bankruptcy history, insolvency history, civil and criminal proceedings, judgments and termination for cause in order to determine whether a firm’s business practices, legal practices and overall reputation in the industry is one that would be acceptable to perform work for Fulton County. The Disclosure Form and Questionnaire is provided in Section 5, Proposal Forms, Form D.

### ***Section 9 – Cost***

The hourly rates of each respondent will be totaled and divided by the number of classifications requested to determine the respondents’ average hourly rate. The respondent with the lowest average hourly rate

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will receive the full 10 points. For respondents with the second, third, fourth, etc., their average hourly rates will be divided into the lowest average hourly rate and multiplied by 10, the total points allowed for cost.

The County has established the following formula to evaluate cost proposals for Request for Proposals (RFP):

**Lowest cost submitted**

***Each successive cost  $\times$  Points allocated for cost in RFP = Cost proposal score***

**3.5 COST PROPOSAL FORMAT AND CONTENT**

The Cost Proposal shall be provided in a **separate sealed envelope**. The Cost Proposal shall include current information and shall be arranged and include content as described below:

***Section 1 - Introduction***

The Proposer shall include an introduction which outlines the contents of the Cost Proposal.

***Section 2 - Completed Cost Proposal Forms***

The Proposer is required to complete **all** of the Cost Proposal Forms provided.

Proposers must provide an hourly rate, based on revenue hours, for transportation services using the Cost Proposal Worksheet (Appendix C – Cost Proposal). A revenue hour will begin when the first passenger is picked-up and end when the last passenger is dropped-off. In general, buses running routes to and from facilities operate an average of five (5) hours per day. Each facility is allowed four (4) group trips per month. Group trips average about three (3) hours. Revenue hours will be billed in increments of fifteen (15) minutes, e.g.: 1.5 hours, 2.75 hours. Successful Proposers may round hours up to the next fifteen minute increment, e.g. an hour and five (5) minutes would be billed as 1.25 hours.

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## **5.2 PROPOSAL FORMS DESCRIPTION**

### **5.2.1 Certification Regarding Debarment**

Proposer shall complete and submit Form A, which certifies that neither it nor its subcontractors are presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or otherwise excluded from doing business with any government agency.

### **5.2.2 Non-Collusion Affidavit of Bidder/Proposer**

The Proposal shall include a copy of Proposal Form B, executed by an authorized officer of the corporation. Proposals developed by a joint venture shall be similarly executed by all joint venture participants.

### **5.2.3 Certificate of Acceptance of Request for Proposal Requirements**

Proposer shall complete and submit Form C, which certifies that Proposer has read the solicitation including all addenda, exhibits, attachments and appendices.

### **5.2.4 Disclosure Form and Questionnaire**

The Proposers and their joint venture partners or team members and first-tier subcontractors, shall complete and submit Form D, which requests disclosure of business and litigation.

### **5.2.5 Georgia Security and Immigration Contractor Affidavit and Agreement**

Proposer shall complete and submit Form F, in order to comply with the requirements of O.C.G.A. 13-10-91 and the Georgia Department of Labor Rule 300-10-01-.02.

### **5.2.6 Georgia Security and Immigration Subcontractor Affidavit**

Proposer shall ensure that any subcontractor(s) that will be utilized for this project shall complete and submit Form G, Subcontractor Affidavit.

### **5.2.7 Professional License**

Proposer and any subcontractor(s) performing work required by state law to be licensed must provide a copy of their license for the work they will perform on this project.

### **5.2.8 Local Preference Affidavit of Bidder/Offer**

Proposer shall complete and submit Form H, which certifies that the Proposer is eligible to receive local preference points.

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**FORM A:                    CERTIFICATION REGARDING DEBARMENT**

- (1) The Proposer certifies that neither it or its subcontractors is presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or otherwise excluded from doing business with any government agency. Any such exclusion may cause prohibition of your firm from participating in any procurement by the Fulton County Government.
- (2) If the Proposer is unable to certify to any of the statements in this certification, such Proposer or subcontractor shall attach an explanation to this bid or proposal.

***INSTRUCTIONS FOR CERTIFICATION***

By signing and submitting this certification, the Proposer is providing the certification set out below:

- (1) The certification in this clause is a material representation of fact upon which reliance will be placed. If it is later determined that the prospective vendor knowingly rendered a false certification, the Purchasing Agent may pursue all available remedies, including suspension and/or debarment, for withdrawal of award or termination of a contract.
- (2) The prospective Proposer shall provide immediate written notice to the Purchasing Agent if at anytime the Proposer learns that its certification was erroneous when submitted or has become erroneous by reason of changed circumstances.
- (3) Proposer shall be under a continuing duty to immediately inform the Purchasing Agent in writing of any changes, if as a result of such changes, the Proposer certification regarding debarment is affected.

**DEBARMENT ORDINANCE**

The following Section 2-322 of Fulton County Code of Laws establishes the procedure for the debarment of contractors.

(a) ***Authority to suspend.***

After reasonable notice to the entity involved and reasonable opportunity for that entity to be heard, the Purchasing Agent, after consultation with user department, the County Manager and the County Attorney shall have the authority to suspend an entity for cause from consideration for award of county contracts. As used in this section, the term entity means any business entity, individual, firm, contractor, subcontractor or business corporation, partnership, limited liability corporation, firm, contractor, subcontractor or business structured; provided, further, that any such entity shall also be subject to suspension under this section if any of its constituents, members, subcontractors at any tier of such entity's and the entity, or any constituent or member, knew or should have known of the commission of the act. The suspension shall be for a period not to exceed three (3) years unless cause is based on a felony conviction for an offense related or

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associated with fraudulent contracting or misappropriation of funds wherein the suspension shall not exceed seven (7) years.

**(b) Causes for Suspension. The causes for suspension include:**

- 1) Conviction for commission of a criminal offense as an incident to obtain or attempting to obtain a public or private contract or subcontract, or in performance of such contract or subcontract;
- 2) Conviction of state or federal statutes of embezzlement, theft, forgery, bribery, falsification or destruction of records, receiving stolen property or other offense indicating a lack of business integrity or business honesty which currently, seriously and directly affects responsibility as a county contractor.
- 3) Conviction of state or federal anti-trust statutes arising out of the solicitation and submission of bids and proposals;
- 4) Violation of contract provisions, as set forth below, of a character which is regarded by the Purchasing Agent to be so serious as to justify suspension action:
  - a. Failure to perform in accordance with the specifications within a time limit provided in a county contract;
  - b. A recent record of failure to perform or unsatisfactory performance in accordance with the terms of one or more contracts; provided, that failure to perform or unsatisfactory performance caused by acts beyond the control of the contractor shall not be considered to be a basis for suspension;
  - c. Material representation of the composition of the ownership or workforce or business entity certified to the county as a minority business enterprise; or
  - d. Falsification of any documents.
- i. For violation of the ethical standards set forth in Fulton County Code Chapter 9, Code of Ethics.
- ii. Knowing misrepresentation to the county, of the use which a majority owned contractor intends to make a minority business enterprise (a business entity at least 51 percent of which is owned and controlled by minority persons, as defined in Fulton County Code Chapter 6, Article B, Minority Business Enterprise Affirmative Action Program and certified as such by the County) as a subcontractor or a joint venture partner, in performing work under contract with the County.

Failure to fully and truthfully provide the information required, may result in the disqualification of your bid/proposal from consideration or termination of the



Contract, once awarded. This document must be completed and included as a part of the bid/proposal package along with other required documents.

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## SECTION 6

### CONTRACT COMPLIANCE REQUIREMENTS

#### 6.1 NON-DISCRIMINATION IN CONTRACTING AND PROCUREMENTS

No modifications or amendment to this Agreement shall be binding upon the parties unless the same is in writing, conforms to Fulton County Policy and Procedure 800-6 governing change orders, is signed by the County's and the Consultant's duly authorized representatives, and entered upon the meeting minutes of the Fulton County Board of Commissioners.

If any portion of the Contract Documents shall be in conflict with any other portion, the various documents comprising the Contract Documents shall govern in the following order of precedence: 1) the Agreement, 2) the RFP, 3) any Addenda, 4) change orders, 5) the exhibits, and 6) portions of Consultant's proposal that was accepted by the County and made a part of the Contract Documents.

The Agreement was approved by the Fulton County Board of Commissioners on **[Insert Board of Commissioners approval date and item number]**.

#### ARTICLE 2. **SEVERABILITY**

If any provision of this Agreement is held to be unenforceable for any reason, the unenforceability thereof shall not affect the remainder of the Agreement, which shall remain in full force and effect, and enforceable in accordance with its terms.

#### ARTICLE 3. **DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT:**

County and Consultant agree the Project is to perform **[Insert project description]**. All exhibits referenced in this agreement are incorporated by reference and constitute an integral part of this Agreement as if they were contained herein.

#### ARTICLE 4. **SCOPE OF SERVICES**

Unless modified in writing by both parties in the manner specified in the agreement, duties of Consultant shall not be construed to exceed those services specifically set forth herein. Consultant agrees to provide all services, products, and data and to perform all tasks described in Exhibit C, Scope of Services.

## ARTICLE 5. DELIVERABLES

Consultant shall deliver to County all reports prepared under the terms of this Agreement that are specified in Exhibit D, Project Deliverables. Consultant shall provide to County all deliverables specified in Exhibit D, Project Deliverables. Deliverables shall be furnished to County by Consultant in a media of form that is acceptable and usable by County at no additional cost at the end of the project.

## ARTICLE 6. SERVICES PROVIDED BY COUNTY

Consultant shall gather from County all available non-privileged data and information pertinent to the performance of the services for the Project. Certain services as described in Exhibit C, Scope of Services, if required, will be performed and furnished by County in a timely manner so as not to unduly delay Consultant in the performance of said obligations. County shall have the final decision as to what data and information is pertinent.

County will appoint in writing a County authorized representative with respect to work to be performed under this Agreement until County gives written notice of the appointment of a successor. The County's authorized representative shall have complete authority to transmit instructions, receive information, and define County's policies, consistent with County rules and regulations. Consultant may rely upon written consents and approvals signed by County's authorized representative that are consistent with County rules and regulations.

## ARTICLE 7. MODIFICATIONS

If during the course of performing the Project, County and Consultant agree that it is necessary to make changes in the Project as described herein and referenced exhibits, such changes will be incorporated by written amendments in the form of Change Orders to this Agreement. Any such Change Order and/or supplemental agreement shall not become effective or binding unless approved by the Board of Commissioners and entered on the minutes. Such modifications shall conform to the requirements of Fulton County Policy 800-6, which is incorporated by reference herein.

## ARTICLE 8. SCHEDULE OF WORK

Consultant shall not proceed to furnish such services and County shall not become obligated to pay for same until a written authorization to proceed (Notice to Proceed) has been sent to Consultant from County. The Consultant shall begin work under this Agreement no later than five (5) days after the effective date of notice to proceed.

ARTICLE 9. **CONTRACT TERM**

ARTICLE 10. **COMPENSATION**

Compensation for work performed by Consultant on Project shall be in accordance with the payment provisions and compensation schedule, attached as Exhibit E, Compensation.

ARTICLE 11. **PERSONNEL AND EQUIPMENT**

Consultant shall designate in writing a person(s) to serve as its authorized representative(s) who shall have sole authority to represent Consultant on all manners pertaining to this contract.

Consultant represents that it has secured or will secure, at its' own expense, all equipment and personnel necessary to complete this Agreement, none of whom shall be employees of or have any contractual relationship with County. All of the services required hereunder will be performed by Consultant under his supervision and all personnel engaged in the work shall be fully qualified and shall be authorized or permitted under law to perform such services.

Written notification shall be immediately provided to County upon change or severance of any of the authorized representative(s), listed key personnel or subcontractor performing services on this Project by Consultant. No changes or substitutions shall be permitted in Consultant's key personnel or subcontractor as set forth herein without the prior written approval of the County. Requests for changes in key personnel or subcontractors will not be unreasonably withheld by County.

ARTICLE 12. **SUSPENSION OF WORK**

**Suspension Notice:** The County may by written notice to the Consultant, suspend at any time the performance of all or any portion of the services to be performed under this Agreement. Upon receipt of a suspension notice, the Consultant must, unless the notice requires otherwise:

- 1) Immediately discontinue suspended services on the date and to the extent specified in the notice;

- 2) Place no further orders or subcontracts for material, services or facilities with respect to suspended services, other than to the extent required in the notice; and
- 3) Take any other reasonable steps to minimize costs associated with the suspension.

**Notice to Resume:** Upon receipt of notice to resume suspended services, the Consultant will immediately resume performance under this Agreement as required in the notice.

### ARTICLE 13. DISPUTES

Except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, any dispute concerning a question of fact arising under this contract which is not disposed of by agreement shall be decided by the Fulton County [insert user department name] designated representative. The representative shall reduce the decision to writing and mail or otherwise furnish a copy thereof to the Consultant. The Consultant shall have 30 days from date the decision is sent to appeal the decision to the County Manager or his designee by mailing or otherwise furnishing to the County Manager or designee, copy of the written appeal. The decision of the County Manager or his designee for the determination of such appeal shall be final and conclusive. This condition shall not be pleaded in any suit involving a question of fact arising under this Agreement, unless the same is fraudulent, or capricious, or arbitrary, or so grossly erroneous as necessarily to imply bad faith, or is not supported by substantial evidence. In connection with any appeal proceeding under this clause, Consultant shall be afforded an opportunity to be heard and to offer evidence in support of an appeal. Pending any final decision of a dispute hereunder, Consultant shall proceed diligently with performance of the Agreement and in accordance with the decision [insert user department name] of the designated representative.

### ARTICLE 14. TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT FOR CAUSE

- (1) Either County or Consultant may terminate work under this Agreement in the event the other party fails to perform in accordance with the provisions of the Agreement. Any party seeking to terminate this Agreement is required to give thirty (30) days prior written notice to the other party.
- (2) Notice of termination shall be delivered by certified mail with receipt for delivery returned to the sender.
- (3) **TIME IS OF THE ESSENCE** and if the Consultant refuses or fails to perform the work as specified in Exhibit C, Scope of Services and maintain the scheduled level of effort as proposed, or any separable part thereof, with such diligence as will insure completion of the work within the specified time period, or any extension or tolling there of, or fails to

complete said work within such time. The County may exercise any remedy available under law or this Agreement. Failure to maintain the scheduled level of effort as proposed or deviation from the aforesaid proposal without prior approval of County shall constitute cause for termination

- (4) The County may, by written notice to Consultant, terminate Consultant's right to proceed with the Project or such part of the Project as to which there has been delay. In such event, the County may take over the work and perform the same to completion, by contract or otherwise, and Consultant shall be required to provide all copies of finished or unfinished documents prepared by Consultant under this Agreement to the County as stated in Exhibit D, "Project Deliverables".
- (5) Consultant shall be entitled to receive compensation for any satisfactory work completed on such documents as reasonably determined by the County.
- (6) Whether or not the Consultant's right to proceed with the work has been terminated, the Consultant shall be liable for any damage to the County resulting from the Consultant's refusal or failure to complete the work within the specified time period, and said damages shall include, but not be limited to, any additional costs associated with the County obtaining the services of another Consultant to complete the project.

#### ARTICLE 15. **TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE OF COUNTY**

Notwithstanding any other provisions, the County may terminate this Agreement for its convenience at any time by a written notice to Consultant. If the Agreement is terminated for convenience by the County, as provided in this article, Consultant will be paid compensation for those services actually performed. Partially completed tasks will be compensated for based on a signed statement of completion to be submitted by Consultant which shall itemize each task element and briefly state what work has been completed and what work remains to be done.

#### ARTICLE 16. **WAIVER OF BREACH**

The waiver by either party of a breach or violation of any provision of this Agreement, shall not operate or be construed to be, a waiver of any subsequent breach or violation of the same or other provision thereof.

## ARTICLE 17. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

Consultant shall perform the services under this Agreement as an independent contractor and nothing contained herein shall be construed to be inconsistent with such relationship or status. Nothing in this Agreement shall be interpreted or construed to constitute Consultant or any of its agents or employees to be the agent, employee or representative of County.

## ARTICLE 18. PROFESSIONAL RESPONSIBILITY

Consultant represents that it has, or will secure at its own expenses, all personnel appropriate to perform all work to be completed under this Agreement;

All the services required hereunder will be performed by Consultant or under the direct supervision of Consultant. All personnel engaged in the Project by Consultant shall be fully qualified and shall be authorized or permitted under applicable State and local law to perform such services.

None of the work or services covered by this Agreement shall be transferred, assigned, or subcontracted by Consultant without the prior written consent of the County.

## ARTICLE 19. COOPERATION WITH OTHER CONSULTANTS

Consultant will undertake the Project in cooperation with and in coordination with other studies, projects or related work performed for, with or by County's employees, appointed committee(s) or other Consultants. Consultant shall fully cooperate with such other related Consultants and County employees or appointed committees. Consultant shall provide within his schedule of work, time and effort to coordinate with other Consultants under contract with County. Consultant shall not commit or permit any act, which will interfere with the performance of work by any other consultant or by County employees. Consultant shall not be liable or responsible for the delays of third parties not under its control nor affiliated with the Consultant in any manner.

## ARTICLE 20. ACCURACY OF WORK

Consultant shall be responsible for the accuracy of his work and shall promptly correct its errors and omissions without additional compensation. Acceptance of the work by the County will not relieve Consultant of the responsibility of subsequent corrections of any errors and the clarification of any ambiguities. Consultant shall prepare any plans, report, fieldwork, or data required by County to correct its errors or omissions. The above consultation, clarification or correction shall be made without added compensation to Consultant. Consultant

shall give immediate attention to these changes so there will be a minimum of delay to others.

#### ARTICLE 21. REVIEW OF WORK

Authorized representatives of County may at all reasonable times review and inspect Project activities and data collected under this Agreement and amendments thereto. All reports, drawings, studies, specifications, estimates, maps and computations prepared by or for Consultant, shall be available to authorized representatives of County for inspection and review at all reasonable times in the main office of County. Acceptance shall not relieve Consultant of its professional obligation to correct, at its expense, any of its errors in work. County may request at any time and Consultant shall produce progress prints or copies of any work as performed under this Agreement. Refusal by Consultant to submit progress reports and/or plans shall be cause for County, without any liability thereof, to withhold payment to consultant until Consultant complies with County's request in this regard. County's review recommendations shall be incorporated into the plans by Consultant.

#### ARTICLE 22. INDEMNIFICATION

The Consultant shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the County, its officers, agents, employees and successors and assigns from and against any and all liability, loss, damages, claims, suits, liens, and judgments including attorneys fees, of whatever nature, including claims for contributions and/or indemnification, for injuries to or death or any person or persons, or damage to property or other rights of any person or persons caused by (1) any failure by the Consultant to perform its obligations under this Agreement; (2) the negligent, intentional or willful misconduct of the Consultant or any of its officers, directors, employees, representatives, agents or Subcontractors in connection with this Agreement; (3) Consultant's fault; or (4) the performance of the Consultant's obligations under this Agreement. The Consultant shall also indemnify the County to the extent provided elsewhere in this Agreement. To the extent there is a determination that Consultant has acted as an agent of the County, the Consultant is specifically excluded from the term "agent" mentioned in the previous sentence, such that Consultant will be required to comply with the requirements of this Article. Consultant's obligation to protect, defend, indemnify, and hold harmless, as set forth hereinabove, shall also included but not limited to any matter arising out of any actual or alleged infringement of any patent, trademark, copyright, or service mark, or any actual or alleged unfair competition disparagement of produce or service, or other business tort of any type whatsoever, or any actual or alleged violation of trade regulations. Consultant shall not indemnify or hold harmless the County for the sole acts or omissions of employees or officers of the County. Consultant further agrees to protect, defend, indemnify and hold harmless County, its officers, agents and employees from and against any and all claims or liability for compensation under the

Worker's Compensation Act arising out of injuries sustained by any employees of Consultant. These Consultant indemnities shall not be limited by reason of the listing of any insurance coverage.

These indemnity provisions are for the protection of the County indemnities only and shall not establish, of themselves, any liability to third parties. The provisions of this article shall survive termination of this Agreement.

#### ARTICLE 23. **CONFIDENTIALITY**

Consultant agrees that its conclusions and any reports are for the confidential information of County and that it will not disclose its conclusions in whole or in part to any persons whatsoever, other than to submit its written documentation to County, and will only discuss the same with it or its authorized representatives, except as required under this Agreement to provide information to the public. Upon completion of this Agreement term, all documents, reports, maps, data and studies prepared by Consultant pursuant thereto and any equipment paid for by County as a result of this Agreement, shall become the property of County and be delivered to [insert user department name].

Articles, papers, bulletins, reports, or other materials reporting the plans, progress, analyses, or results and findings of the work conducted under this Agreement shall not be presented publicly or published without prior approval in writing of County.

It is further agreed that if any information concerning the Project, its conduct results, or data gathered or processed should be released by Consultant without prior approval from County, the release of the same shall constitute grounds for termination of this Agreement without indemnity to Consultant, but should any such information be released by County or by Consultant with such prior written approval, the same shall be regarded as Public information and no longer subject to the restrictions of this Agreement.

#### ARTICLE 24. **OWNERSHIP OF INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY AND INFORMATION**

Consultant agrees that Fulton County is the sole owner of all information, data, and materials that are developed or prepared subject to this Agreement. Consultant or any subcontractor is not allowed to use or sell any information subject to this contract for educational, publication, profit, research or any other purpose without the written and authorized consent of the **[Insert User Department Representative for project]**. All electronic files used in connection to this Agreement, which are by definition, any custom software files used in connection to this Agreement, (collectively, the "Software"), shall be turned over to the County for its use after termination hereof and Consultant shall have no interest of any kind in such electronic files. Any required licenses and fees for

the Software or other required materials shall be purchased and/or paid for by Consultant and registered in the name of the **[Insert User Department Representative for project]**, if possible. The Software as defined hereunder, specifically excludes all software, documentation, information, and materials in which Consultant has pre-existing proprietary rights and/or has otherwise been licensed to Consultant prior to this Agreement, and any upgrades, updates, modifications or enhancements thereto. Consultant agrees to provide at no cost to County any upgrades to any software used in connection with this Agreement which may be subsequently developed or upgraded for a period of three (3) years from the date of completion of the work under the Agreement, except in the case of commercial Software licensed to the County or **[Insert User Department Representative for project]**. Any information developed for use in connection with this Agreement may be released as public domain information by the County at its sole discretion.

#### ARTICLE 25. **COVENANT AGAINST CONTINGENT FEES**

Consultant warrants that no person or selling agency has been employed or retained to solicit or secure this Agreement upon an agreement or understanding for a commission, percentage, brokerage or contingent fee, excepting bona fide employees maintained by Consultant for the purpose of securing business and that Consultant has not received any non-County fee related to this Agreement without the prior written consent of County. For breach or violation of this warranty, County shall have the right to annul this Agreement without liability or at its discretion to deduct from the Contract Price or consideration the full amount of such commission, percentage, brokerage or contingent fee.

#### ARTICLE 26. **INSURANCE**

Consultant agrees to obtain and maintain during the entire term of this Agreement, all of the insurance required as specified in the Agreement documents, Exhibit G, Insurance and Risk Management Forms, with the County as an additional insured and shall furnish the County a Certificate of Insurance showing the required coverage. The cancellation of any policy of insurance required by this Agreement shall meet the requirements of notice under the laws of the State of Georgia as presently set forth in the Georgia Code.

#### ARTICLE 27. **PROHIBITED INTEREST**

##### Section 27.01 **Conflict of interest:**

Consultant agrees that it presently has no interest and shall acquire no interest direct or indirect that would conflict in any manner or degree with the performance of its service hereunder. Consultant further agrees that, in the performance of the Agreement, no person having any such interest shall be employed.

Section 27.02 **Interest of Public Officials:**

No member, officer or employee of County during his tenure shall have any interest, direct or indirect, in this Agreement or the proceeds thereof.

ARTICLE 28. **SUBCONTRACTING**

Consultant shall not subcontract any part of the work covered by this Agreement or permit subcontracted work to be further subcontracted without prior written approval of County.

ARTICLE 29. **ASSIGNABILITY**

Consultant shall not assign or subcontract this Agreement or any portion thereof without the prior expressed written consent of County. Any attempted assignment or subcontracting by Consultant without the prior expressed written consent of County shall at County's sole option terminate this Agreement without any notice to Consultant of such termination. Consultant binds itself, its successors, assigns, and legal representatives of such other party in respect to all covenants, agreements and obligations contained herein.

ARTICLE 30. **ANTI-KICKBACK CLAUSE**

Salaries of engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, clerical and technicians performing work under this Agreement shall be paid unconditionally and not less often than once a month without deduction or rebate on any account except only such payroll deductions as are mandatory by law. Consultant hereby promises to comply with all applicable "Anti-Kickback" Laws, and shall insert appropriate provisions in all subcontracts covering work under this Agreement.

ARTICLE 31. **AUDITS AND INSPECTORS**

At any time during normal business hours and as often as County may deem necessary, Consultant shall make available to County and/or representatives of the County for examination all of its records with respect to all matters covered by this Agreement.

It shall also permit County and/or representative of the County to audit, examine and make copies, excerpts or transcripts from such records of personnel, conditions of employment and other data relating to all matters covered by this Agreement. Consultant's records of personnel, conditions of employment, and financial statements (hereinafter "Information") constitute trade secrets and are considered confidential and proprietary by Consultant. To the extent County audits or examines such Information related to this Agreement, County shall not disclose or otherwise make available to third parties any such Information without

Consultant's prior written consent unless required to do so by a court order. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as granting County any right to make copies, excerpts or transcripts of such information outside the area covered by this Agreement without the prior written consent of Consultant. Consultant shall maintain all books, documents, papers, accounting records and other evidence pertaining to costs incurred on the Project and used in support of its proposal and shall make such material available at all reasonable times during the period of the Agreement and for three years from the date of final payment under the Agreement, for inspection by County or any reviewing agencies and copies thereof shall be furnished upon request and at no additional cost to County. Consultant agrees that the provisions of this Article shall be included in any Agreements it may make with any subcontractor, assignee or transferee.

#### ARTICLE 32. **ACCOUNTING SYSTEM**

Consultant shall have an accounting system, which is established, and maintaining in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. Consultant must account for cost in a manner consistent with generally accepted accounting procedures, as approved by Fulton County.

#### ARTICLE 33. **VERBAL AGREEMENT**

No verbal agreement or conversation with any officer, agent or employee of County either before, during or after the execution of this Agreement, shall affect or modify any of the terms of obligations herein contained, nor shall such verbal agreement or conversation entitle Consultant to any additional payment whatsoever under the terms of this Agreement. All changes to this shall be in writing and the form of a change order in supplemental agreement, approved by the County, and entered on the Minutes of the Board of Commissioners.

#### ARTICLE 34. **NOTICES**

All notices shall be in writing and delivered in person or transmitted by certified mail, postage prepaid.

**ARTICLE 35. JURISDICTION**

This Agreement shall be administered and interpreted under the laws of the State of Georgia. Jurisdiction of litigation arising from this Agreement shall be in that state. If any part of this Agreement is found to be in conflict with applicable laws, such part shall be inoperative, null and void insofar as it is in conflict with said laws, but the remainder of this Agreement shall be in full force and effect.

Whenever reference is made in the Agreement to standards or codes in accordance with which work is to be performed, the edition or revision of the standards or codes current on the effective date of this Agreement shall apply, unless otherwise expressly stated.

**ARTICLE 36. EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY**

During the performance of this Agreement, Consultant agrees as follows:

Section 36.01 Consultant will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, creed, color, sex or national origin;

Section 36.02 Consultant will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by, or on behalf of, Consultant state that all qualified applicants, will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, creed, color, sex or national origin;

Section 36.03 Consultant will cause the foregoing provisions to be inserted in all subcontracts for any work covered by the Agreement so that such provision will be binding upon each subcontractor, provided that the foregoing provisions shall not apply to contracts or subcontracts for standard commercial supplies or raw materials.

#### ARTICLE 37. **FORCE MAJEURE**

Neither County nor Consultant shall be deemed in violation of this Agreement if either is prevented from performing its obligations hereunder for any reason beyond its control, including but not limited to acts of God, civil or military authority, act of public enemy, accidents, fires, explosions, earthquakes, floods or catastrophic failures of public transportation, provided however, that nothing herein shall relieve or be construed to relieve Consultant from performing its obligations hereunder in the event of riots, rebellions or legal strikes.

#### ARTICLE 38. **OPEN RECORDS ACT**

The Georgia Open Records Act, O.C.G.A. Section 50-18-70 et seq., applies to this Agreement. The Consultant acknowledges that any documents or computerized data provided to the County by the Consultant may be subject to release to the public. The Consultant also acknowledges that documents and computerized data created or held by the Consultant in relation to the Agreement may be subject to release to the public, to include documents turned over to the County. The Consultant shall cooperate with and provide assistance to the County in rapidly responding to Open Records Act requests. The Consultant shall notify the County of any Open Records Act requests no later than 24 hours following receipt of any such requests by the Consultant. The Consultant shall promptly comply with the instructions or requests of the County in relation to responding to Open Records Act requests.

#### ARTICLE 39. **CONSULTANT'S COMPLIANCE WITH ALL ASSURANCES OR PROMISES MADE IN RESPONSE TO PROCUREMENT**

Where the procurement documents do not place a degree or level of service relating to the scope of work, M/FBE participation, or any other matter relating to the services being procured, should any Consultant submit a response to the County promising to provide a certain level of service for the scope of work, M/FBE participation, or any other matter, including where such promises or assurances are greater than what is required by the procurement documents, and should this response containing these promises or assurances be accepted by the County and made a part of the Contract Documents, then the degree or level of service promised relating to the scope of work, M/FBE participation, or other matter shall be considered to be a material part of the Agreement between the Consultant and the County, such that the Consultant's failure to provide the agreed upon degree or level of service or participation shall be a material breach

of the Agreement giving the County just cause to terminate the Agreement for cause, pursuant to ARTICLE 14 of the Agreement.

ARTICLE 40. **INVOICING AND PAYMENT**

Consultant shall submit monthly invoices for work performed during the previous calendar month, in a form acceptable to the County and accompanied by all support documentation requested by the County, for payment and for services that were completed during the preceding phase. The County shall review for approval of said invoices. The County shall have the right not to pay any invoice or part thereof if not properly supported, or if the costs requested or a part thereof, as determined by the County, are reasonably in excess of the actual stage of completion.

**Time of Payment:** Invoices for payment shall be submitted to County by the first (1st) calendar day of the month to facilitate processing for payment in that same month. Invoices received after the first (1st) calendar day of the month may not be paid until the last day of the following month. The County shall make payments to Consultant by U.S. mail approximately thirty (30) days after receipt of a proper invoice. Parties hereto expressly agree that the above contract term shall supersede the rates of interest, payment periods, and contract and subcontract terms provided for under the Georgia Prompt Pay Act, O.C.G.A. 13-11-1 et seq., pursuant to 13-11-7(b), and the rates of interest, payment periods, and contract and subcontract terms provided for under the Prompt Pay Act shall have no application to this Agreement; parties further agree that the County shall not be liable for any interest or penalty arising from late payments.

**County's Right to Withhold Payments:** The County may withhold payments for services that involve disputed costs, involve disputed audits, or are otherwise

performed in an inadequate fashion. Payments withheld by the County will be released and paid to the Consultant when the services are subsequently performed adequately and on a timely basis, the causes for disputes are reconciled or any other remedies or actions stipulated by the County are satisfied. The County shall promptly pay any undisputed items contained in such invoices.

**Payment of Sub-consultants/Suppliers:** The Consultant must certify in writing that all sub-consultants of the Consultant and suppliers have been promptly paid for work and materials and previous progress payments received. In the event the prime Consultant is unable to pay sub-consultants or suppliers until it has received a progress payment from Fulton County, the prime Consultant shall pay all sub-consultants or supplier funds due from said progress payments within forty-eight (48) hours of receipt of payment from Fulton County and in no event later than fifteen days as provided for by State Law.

**Acceptance of Payments by Consultant; Release.** The acceptance by the Consultant of any payment for services under this Agreement will, in each instance, operate as, and be a release to the County from, all claim and liability to the Consultant for work performed or furnished for or relating to the service for which payment was accepted, unless the Consultant within five (5) days of its receipt of a payment, advises the County in writing of a specific claim it contends is not released by that payment.

#### ARTICLE 41. NON-APPROPRIATION

This Agreement states the total obligation of the County to the Consultant for the calendar year of execution. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Agreement, the obligation of the County to make payments provided under this Agreement shall be subject to annual appropriations of funds thereof by the governing body of the County and such obligation shall not constitute a pledge of the full faith and credit of the County within the meaning of any constitutional debt limitation. The Director of Finance shall deliver written notice to the Consultant in the event the County does not intend to budget funds for the succeeding Contract year.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Agreement, if sufficient funds have not been appropriated to support continuation of this Agreement for an additional calendar year or an additional term of the Agreement, this Agreement shall terminate absolutely and without further obligation on the part of the County at the close of the calendar year of its execution and at the close of each succeeding calendar year of which it may be renewed, unless a shorter termination period is provided or the County suspends performance pending the appropriation of funds.

#### ARTICLE 42. WAGE CLAUSE

Consultant shall agree that in the performance of this Agreement the Consultant will comply with all lawful agreements, if any, which the Consultant had made with any association, union, or other entity, with respect to wages, salaries, and working conditions, so as not to cause inconvenience, picketing, or work stoppage.

## Appendix A – Service Delivery Area Options

### Option 1 – North Fulton Facilities

For Senior Centers and Adult Day Care, this area covers all of North Fulton County north of the city of Atlanta. Participants in the northernmost area of the county are sometimes several miles apart; making ride times too long if large buses are used. Proposers responding to this option will be required to provide all types of trips to and from all centers in this area.

For the North Training Center, this area covers all of North Fulton County including Sandy Springs, Buckhead, the Bankhead Hwy corridor and the Fulton Industrial area to MLK, Jr. Dr., near Charlie Brown Airport. Consumers in the northernmost area of the county are sometimes several miles apart. A greater number of smaller vehicles would accommodate acceptable ride times in this area. The Roswell and Sandy Springs consumers are generally closer together. Proposers responding to this option will be required to provide all types of trips to and from the center in this area.

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## Option 4 – Demand Response Services

The intent is to select qualified Proposers to provide trips to and from medical appointments for seniors, age 60 and above, and to special meetings and functions approved by the Fulton County Office of Aging. The Fulton County Office of Aging will maintain a database of certified passengers. Trips will be scheduled in the following manner:

- A. County staff will accept trip requests from certified seniors.
- B. County staff will forward trip requests to Successful Proposers on a rotating basis, or by service area.
- C. The successful Proposer must accept or decline the trip within 4 hours of receipt. Trips not accepted within 4 hours will be considered declined and the trip will be forwarded to the next successful Proposer in the rotation.
- D. Successful Proposers must submit to the County their daily pick-up list, including pick-up times, two (2) days in advance.
- E. On the day prior to scheduled trips, the successful Proposers must contact all passengers to inform them of name of the company providing the service, the pick-up time, and contact information for the company.
- F. County staff will contact the clients to confirm the name and contact number for the Successful Proposer, and a pick-up time.
- G. At random County staff will contact clients on the day after a scheduled trip for comments on the service.
- H. Successful Proposer may be required to transport clients for routine medical appointments, therapy, employment locations, or rehabilitation centers. Such trips will be assigned to the Successful Proposer to perform as a subscription trip. The Successful Proposer will be expected to perform the trip on a routine basis until County staff informs them of a change in the schedule.

Trips may be canceled up to thirty minutes prior to the pick-up time noted on the daily pick-up list submitted by the successful vendor two (2) days prior to the schedule trip. Canceled within thirty (30) minutes of the pick-up time may be billed as no shows.
