This Addendum forms a part of the contract documents and **modifies** the original RFP documents as noted below:

### **Responses to Questions**

1. At the Pre proposal meeting, it was noted that the firms are required to submit a Payment Bond in the amount of 100% of the Contract Amount. For these types of projects, requiring Professional Engineering services, our insurance company would only provide Professional Liability coverage. And, since we do not perform Construction Services, our insurance company will not provide such a Bond. Please clarify as we see our involvement for this project to be Professional Services.

**Answer:** Title 30 of the Georgia Code of Transportation; specifically Code Section 32-4-67, currently requires a Payment Bond for Professional Services. This requirement would only apply to the contractor who is awarded the contract by the Fulton County Board of Commissioners. HB 192 currently in consideration by the Georgia Legislative would amend Code Section 32-4-67 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the proposal guaranty by the bidder on a County contract, so as to exempt contracts for Engineering or other Professional Services for the guaranty. If this bill passes, Fulton County would waive this requirement for the contract awardee.

2. In the past, when submitting proposals to Fulton County, I have not required the subcontractors that we are working with to fill out Exhibit C for their use of subcontractors for specific specialties (i.e. traffic counts, drilling, etc.). Is this a requirement for the subcontractor? My understanding is that the Prime only submits this form for their direct subcontractor utilization.

**Answer:** The Prime Contractor completes Exhibit C, which is the Schedule of Intended Subcontractor Utilization Form. The Prime Contractor is to complete the entire package by submitting all subcontractors that will be working on the project.
