Question 1: Page 3-3 states the project will require obtaining land disturbance permits and “any other permits required for construction”. What other permits does the County foresee needing for this project?

Response: The County does not anticipate any other permits, but for instance, if the survey and engineering tasks disclose the need for an Army Corps of Engineers nationwide permit the consultant will be required obtain coverage under that permit.

Question 2: Pages 3-3 and 3-7 state that each of the 3 primary project Task Orders will be authorized upon completion of the previously assigned Task Order. Would the County allow the Engineering Analysis and Design to begin prior to completion of the Land Survey? There are analysis/design tasks that can be started that are not dependent upon the survey data.

Response: The County will not authorize any task order until the preceding task is completed to the satisfaction of the County. The consultant may proceed on any analysis/design task(s) they see fit at their own risk.

Question 3: Page 3-11, “Past Performance” – Can any of the 3 projects represent past experience of a key team member prior to joining the proposing firm?

Response: Yes.

Question 4: Can you provide the template/requirements that must be completed for a County land disturbance permit?

Question 5: Can the electronic files of the conceptual plans/drawings be made available to the proposers?

Response: No. The conceptual analysis was limited to performing hydrologic analysis and preliminary design calculations.

Question 6: Will the allowable time for Task 3 Permitting (124 days) be sufficient to secure EPD permitting?

Response: A Fulton County land disturbance permit is required; Fulton County does not anticipate permitting through EPD.

Question 7: RIGHT OF WAY: Is all of the proposed design anticipated to remain within the existing Right of Way?

Response: No. Most of the work will be off right of way, on the properties on which the detention ponds are located.

Question 8: Section 3- Page 3-5 – Task 2- references use of “the Stormwater Quality Site Development Review Tool as published by the District”. Please clarify if this refers to Section 1.2.2 Minimum Standards for Development of the Stormwater Manual, or an online tool, or otherwise.

Response: The reference is to the Stormwater Quality Site Development Review Tool, available at <http://www.northgeorgiawater.org/stormwater/tools-for-local-governments>.

Question 9: Will the utilities be superimposed on the erosion control plans, or will a separate break out set of utility plans be required?

Response: The County expects the consultant to superimpose utilities on the erosion control plans, and grading and drainage plans at a minimum. It will be up to the consultant to determine if a set of utility plans is required to demonstrate the consultant’s design in sufficient detail to provide guidance to the contractor when these projects go to construction.
