Questions and Response for proposal 11RFP77314A-DR, **Housing Provider for Jail Diversion Mental Health Program**

1. In reviewing the RFP we were unable to determine the number of diversion beds the county expects to contract out on a daily basis. Is that information available?

Response: We remove clients from the jail on a daily/weekly basis. Not all of the clients released from jail need placement. Only those that are homeless need placement.

The level of care that the client requires determines the type of residential placement recommended for the client to the court. At any given time, court services program serves 15 to 35 clients a day in residential placement. I do not have a provider serving 15 to 35 clients at one time. This number is dispersed among different types of residential providers, i.e. personal care homes, semi-independent living situations, substance abuse treatment facilities, etc.
