Greenway Trail Benefits

- ❑ Alternative transportation system to parks, schools, shopping centers and community facilities
- ❑ Improve quality of life and health
- ❑ Provide recreation source
- ❑ Increase property value
- ❑ Protect and preserve the natural environment



Greenway Trail Type

- 21.1 miles greenway trails that follow adjacent to a creek



Trail Types

- 89.0 miles (off-road trails)-greenway trails that follow adjacent to a public roadway



Trailheads



- ❑ Trailhead - An access point to a trail segment. Located throughout the trail network system. Often accompanied by various public facilities, such as parking areas, restrooms, water, directional and informational signs, and a trail use register. A staging area that caters to trail day use.

- ❑ South Fulton TrailNet has 21 trailheads (additional trailheads may be included during the design phase):
 - ✓ Parks
 - ✓ Community centers
 - ✓ Schools
 - ✓ Fire stations

Maintenance & Security

Maintenance

- ❑ Fulton County Trail Maintenance Division (coordinated through Parks and Recreation and Public Works departments)
- ❑ Adopt-a-Trail program

Security

- ❑ Current Fulton County public safety resources are available for off-road trails (89.0 miles). High visibility. On existing right of way.
- ❑ Additional Fulton County public safety resources are required for greenway trails (21.1 miles) that follow adjacent to a creek.
- ❑ Law enforcement bicycle patrol unit, greenway trail use during daylight hours, emergency call boxes and encourage buddy system.
