Sec. 126-46. - Creation; organization; members.

The Board of Commissioners of Fulton County does hereby create a council of citizens known as the Fulton County Arts Council, to be structured and to function as follows:

- (1) The arts council shall be composed of 15 residents of the county.
- (2) Initially each member of the board of commissioners shall appoint two persons to serve on the council, one person to serve for a one-year term and one person to serve for a two-year term. Thereafter, each year each member of the board of commissioners shall appoint one member for a two-year term.
- (3) The chairman of the arts council shall be appointed to a two-year term by a majority vote of the board of commissioners.
- (4) The council shall elect a vice-chairman and a secretary from its membership.

- (a) More specifically, the board of commissioners will request the arts council to submit an art plan for each calendar year which will include:
 - (1) A definition of needs;
 - (2) A resolution of these needs; and
 - (3) A request for support of programs by specific contracts which would include:
 - a. Contracts with larger organizations for annual programs; and
 - b. Contracts with smaller organizations for semiannual programs.
- (b) The arts council, as here established, shall give priority to programs which will introduce the arts to new audiences, and will ensure that the enjoyment of the arts is available to all citizens of the county and most especially children, the elderly, the handicapped, and those citizens who, because of economic or other circumstances, have not had ready and regular access to the arts.
