

## Randy Hanzlick, Medical Examiner

Randy Hanzlick, MD, is a board-certified forensic pathologist, Professor of Forensic Pathology at Emory University School of Medicine, and Chief Medical Examiner for Fulton County, Georgia. He is a Past-President of the National Association of Medical Examiners (NAME) and former Pathology/Biology Section Officer for the American Academy of Forensic Sciences (AAFS), and has received numerous awards including NAME's Life Service Award and the AAFS Distinguished Fellow Award. His publications include two texts, several manuals, multiple chapters, and nearly 200 journal articles. Dr. Hanzlick's major interest areas include the development of professional guidelines, improvement in death investigation practices, death certification and mortality data, electronic data system development and data sharing, and the role of the medical examiner in public health surveillance and epidemiological research. Over the past several years, Dr. Hanzlick has also been involved in infant death investigation protocols and training funded by the CDC, and in NIJ-funded programs to improve the management of missing and unidentified persons and the investigation of deaths following deployment of conductive energy devices.
