

Counts shown reflect the number of confirmed cases using the date of most recent positive sample collection. The Georgia Department of Public Health defines a confirmed cases as someone with a positive molecular test, also known as PCR. A confirmed case only accounts for those who sought out confirmatory testing via PCR and does not account for those who only use at-home or antigen testing. **Note:** Delays in data reporting may cause changes in data counts, particularly in the shaded portion. Data throughout this report are preliminary and subject to ongoing data cleaning processes, and thus are subject to change.


