

Physical Fitness

The Marshal's Physical Fitness agenda is a volunteer program offered to sworn deputies and civilian staff. The opportunity was introduced by Marshal Antonio in 2008 because of his concern for good health; he implemented the program one day a week for an hour of exercise. The objective is to introduce a fitness regiment that challenges cardiovascular, muscle endurance and balance. Captain Morton who is the physical fitness manager has designed a 1.6 mile run/walk course that incorporates terrain elevations and declines. Before activities begin; dynamic stretching is done to warm muscles to prevent injuries. During the route various calisthenics are applied to challenge the conditioning efforts. When the route has been completed, static stretches and deep breathing are done to cool down and relax the body. The program continues to be a success as participants intermittently volunteer.





Courtroom & Field Exercises





The courtroom deputies felt that it was extremely important that they have hands-on training in the courtroom to assist in dealing with citizens that become combative in court. They received training from an outside agency instructor that taught them various defensive moves and tactical techniques that can be used to their advantage to subdue combative or aggressive citizens while in a courtroom setting.

During 2011, the Marshal's Department conducted three sessions of annual 40 hour in-service training which is 20 hours more than required by The Peace Officer's Standard Training (P.O.S.T.) to maintain their certification. These mandatory training sessions required for each deputy helps them to keep abreast of all current materials and tactics in law enforcement.

The different subjects taught during the training sessions include; Incident Command, Hazardous Material Awareness, CPR and First Aid Refresher, Legal Update, Ethics and Professionalism, Bias Based Policing, TASER Recertification, Bomb Recognition, Mental Health, Canine Awareness, Active Shooter Response, Sovereign Citizens Awareness and Defensive Tactics. This training also incorporated our biannual Firearms Requalification which included a 1 hour block on Use of Deadly Force. The department also conducted a monthly Firearms practice day.

The Marshal's employees also attended several of the advanced classes at the Fulton County Public Safety Training Center, the Georgia Public Safety Training Center and other off-site training centers as well. These classes held at the above-mentioned sites included: Defensive Tactics Instructor, Crisis Intervention Team Training (CIT), Interpersonal Communications, Instructor Training Course, Interviews and Interrogations, Criminal Procedures, Search Warrants and Affidavits, Shoot House 1, Health and Wellness, Fit for Street Duty, Supervision Module's 1, 2 and 3, Fire Safety, TASER Annual Conference, TASER Instructor and Field Training Officer.



Regrettably on September 22, 2011 our department experienced a tragic event because one of our deputies, Cpl. Jones, was severely hurt during a grease fire at his home. The fire caused 1st, 2nd, and 3rd degree burns to his face, arms and chest, requiring him to have skin graft surgery. Thankfully his recovery is coming along quite well. We are a fairly small department and we are pretty close, so this has really affected us all.

Cpl. Jones was at his home on Thursday evening asleep in his bed. His children were in the kitchen cooking and a grease fire started in a pot. The children rushed to get him out of bed to alert him of the fire in the pan on the stove. Cpl. Jones ran into the kitchen and saw that the fire was contained to the pan. He put on oven mitts and picked the pan up by the handle. He began making his way to the door with the intention of throwing the contents of the pan onto the pavement. Not knowing the weather conditions when Cpl. Jones opened the door a gust of wind blew the fire and the grease on his

face, neck, chest and arms. His wife contacted emergency personnel and he was transported to Grady Hospital. He received the worst burns on his arm and chest and had to have skin graft surgery. He stayed in the Grady Burn Unit for approximately three weeks.

Cpl. Jones has worked in this department since July 2005. He comes to work every day with a smile on his face. He is always available to assist and give a lending hand. Through this event he has maintained the positive attitude for which he is known for. His presence is truly missed and we eagerly anticipate his return.

"Cpl. Jones is truly an inspiration and I think this has been displayed through all the selfless acts that he performs for the Marshal's Department and other areas of Fulton County," stated Reneka Barnes-Davis, Records and Property Custodian, Fulton County Marshal's Department.

This tragic event has taken a financial toll on his family so we as a department and family decided to host a charity basketball game and donate the proceeds to Cpl. Jones and his Family. As a result of this tragic incident we have partnered with the Fulton County Fire Rescue Department to host fire safety education classes with the Marshal's Department and State Court employees on November 10 and November 14.

Cpt. Gary F. Brown retired on February 24, 2011. He began his career with the Marshal's Department on August 15, 1988.




