EARLY VOTING

Early Voting will take place at 24 locations. A list of the locations and early voting times are located in this brochure

ABSENTEE VOTING

An absentee ballot is a paper ballot mailed to you. You must request an absentee ballot in writing. Request an Absentee Ballot as soon as possible and no later than **Friday, March 20, 2020 by 5:00 p.m.** You must request an absentee ballot for every election for which you want to vote, unless you are over 65, disabled, or in the military. If any of the exceptions apply to you, then your absentee ballot request is good for that year's election cycle.

You can request an absentee ballot by calling the Fulton County Registration and Elections' office at 404-612-7060.

Voters who have physical disabilities or need assistance reading and writing may receive absentee ballot assistance from any person of the elector's choice, EXCEPT elector's employer or agent of employer, officer or agent of elector's union, candidate on the ballot of family member of candidate (unless disabled/illiterate elector is related to candidate).*

Absentee ballots can be returned by voter personally, by voter's family member, by individual residing in voter's household, by disabled voter's caregiver, or by employee of jail where elector is in custody.*

Friday, March 20, 2020, is the last day an absentee ballot may be mailed for the March 24 election. Your Absentee Ballot must be returned to the Fulton County Absentee Ballot Unit no later than 7:00 p.m. on **Tuesday, March 24, 2020**.

VOTER IDENTIFICATION

Georgia law requires that you present one of the following forms of valid photo identification when you vote:

- 1. A Georgia driver's license (including an expired Georgia driver's license)
- 2. Any valid state or federal government issued photo ID, to include:
 - a. A free Georgia voter identification card issued by your county's registrars;
 - b. Georgia State ID issued by the Georgia Department of Driver Services (DDS);
 - c. A valid student ID card issued by a Georgia public college, university or technical school;
 - d. A valid out-of-state driver's license;
 - e. public transit issued photo ID card; and
 - f. Any other federal or state agency or government issued photo ID card.
- 3. A valid United States passport;
- 4. A valid employee photo identification card issued by any branch, department, agency, or entity of the United States government, this state, or any county, municipality, board, authority, or other entity of this state;
- 5. A valid United States military photo identification card; or
- 6. A valid tribal photo identification card.



VOTERS WITH DISABILITIES

Fulton County has tools in place to help voters of all abilities participate in the election process. Voters who are unable to sign their name, unable to see or mark a ballot, unable to operate the voting equipment, or enter the voting booth without assistance, can receive assistance from any person of the elector's choice EXCEPT elector's employer or agent of employer, officer or agent of elector's union, candidate or family member of candidate (unless disabled elector is related to candidate). *HB 316 amends OCGA 21-2-409(b).

Voting machines are available to accommodate those with disabilities. Please request a copy of our VOTERS WITH DISABILITIES brochure for the specific information.

VOTER REGISTRATION AND ADDRESS CHANGES

You must be registered to vote at least 29 days prior to any given election in which you wish to vote. Your registration will remain active unless you do not vote in three election cycles.

You are eligible to vote in Georgia if you are:

- A citizen of the United States
- A legal resident
- At least 18 years old (you may register at 17-1/2 years old) *HB 316 amends OCGA 21-2-216 (a) and (c) as long as the registered voter will turn 18 on or before Election Day, they are eligible to vote in that election.
- Have not been found to be mentally incompetent by the court
- Are not serving a sentence for a felony
- Meet all other State requirements, such as showing a photo ID

To change your address and or name and vote in your current resident precinct, you must file a change of address with the Department of Driver's Services (DDS), fill out a State Voter Registration application (online at

<u>www.fultonelections.com</u> or <u>www.sos.ga.gov</u>; click on: Elections, Voter Info and Voter Registration).

A 24-Hour Interactive Voice Response System:

Starting one week prior to Election Day, voters may call Fulton County's Voter Registration Office, 24-hours a day, 7 days a week at 404-730-7072 and be connected to an interactive voice response system, which will provide voters their voting locations.

OBSERVATION, VIEW AND TABULATION OF ELECTION RESULTS

OBSERVATION OF COUNT – Appointed Tabulation Center Poll Watchers may observe the tabulation of votes until all votes are tallied in the designated area of the Ballot Tabulation Center at 1365 English Street, Atlanta, GA 30318.

INFORMATION DISSEMINATION AND VIEW OF ELECTION RESULTS

Fulton County Registration and Elections Department provide unofficial and official Election Results electronically at no cost.

Election Night - All results displayed on election night are UNOFFICIAL and include Absentee Ballots, but do not include Provisional Ballots.

Unofficial Precinct Returns

The first returns are projected to be available at approximately 8:30 p.m. on election night and the final returns are projected to be available at approximately 11:30 p.m.

Day after Election

All results displayed on our web portal the day after an election are UNOFFICIAL until certified by the Board of Registration and Elections. They include Absentee Ballots, but do not include Provisional Ballots.

Absentee Ballots

The opening of absentee ballot envelopes begins at 7:00 a.m. and tabulation of ballots will begin at 7:00 p.m. on Election Night until all ballots are counted at the Fulton County Elections Preparation Center at 1365 English Street, Atlanta, GA 30318.

PROVISIONAL BALLOTS

Provisional voting allows the voter to cast a ballot in person, even if all the requirements for doing so cannot be met at the time. The provisional ballot will count if the problem is solved within three days after Election Day.

Provisional voters have until 5:00 p.m. the Friday after the election to provide any required documentation. To check Provisional ballot status, voters may call 1-866-677-5328.

The three most common reasons for voting a provisional ballot are:

- 1. Voter is unable to show one of the required forms of photo ID when voting in person;
- 2. When voter first registered to vote in Georgia, registration was by mail, the voter did not provide any identification at that time, and was unable to present acceptable identification the first time voter voted in person; or
- 3. Voter's name does not appear on the list of registered voters in the precinct.
