Chair Allen requested the agenda to be amended to add the emergency polling place change that impacted voters assigned to the Istanbul Cultural Center. This location has declined to be a precinct on Election Day due to the safety concerns of their staff and voters.

Chair Allen entertained a motion to amend the agenda to add the Discussion of Emergency Polling Place Changes before the list maintenance presentation. The motion was made by **Mrs. Crawford**, seconded by **Mr. Selby**, and carried by a unanimous vote of 4-0.

Director Williams greeted and provided the BRE a brief overview:

- DRE preparation for the 2026 Election Cycle
- Poll worker Training for Advance Voting (AV) and Election Day (ED)
- Equipment Allocations
- Confirming Polling Place locations
- Processing Voter Registration applications prior to the deadline (April 20, 2026)

Madam Director informed the BRE that they may ask questions regarding the monthly ops report.

Ms. Adams asked **Director Williams** was the DRE on target for hiring for AV and Election Day.

Director Williams responded yes, for both Advance Voting (AV) and Election Day (ED)

Ms. Adams inquired about daily pick-up of materials.

Director Williams explained the process:

- Two Couriers per location
- Chain of custody forms completed
- Materials secured and delivered to the Hub
- Materials retained in the Secure retention area

Ms. Adam inquired about the law regarding the homeless population to get them in compliance.

Director Williams explained the website to reflect the legislative changes passed regarding homeless (unhoused) voters. Mechanism used to ensure voters are aware:

Chair Allen suggested the BRE members provide places in their areas with the correspondence regarding unhoused citizens.

Ms. Adams asked do the DRE track the number of voters registered at homeless shelters

Director Williams addressed social media misinformation regarding unhoused voters that are registered. She said that there's a significant number of voters that are currently inactive in the database and most never voted.

Chair Allen asked **Chief Glenn** for her insight on the unhoused community.

Chief Glenn echoed **Director Williams'** previous comments regarding unhoused voters.

Mrs. Crawford reminded the public that it's illegal to remove voters in accordance with NVRA. The voter must request to be removed; otherwise, the voter can only be removed after 2 Federal Election without voting has passed

Ms. Adams inquired about the 18 time-limited couriers that are assigned to Advance Voting locations.

Director Williams responded that we have those same positions every election. The 18 couriers are included in that daily election material pick-up, but they have other duties as well.

Ms. Crawford asked was the sequence of numbers corrected.

Director Williams explained that is one of the updates that being resolved currently.

Ms. Adams complimented the use of this tool and asked for data on voters that are using this tool.

Director Williams explained that after utilizing the tool for a couple months, they will pull the data and update the board.

Mr. Selby inquired about information to provide to voters during the upcoming election as a reminder that the DRE is utilizing a text/email platform.

Director Williams confirmed that they will work with External Affairs to present some collateral to voters. The DRE will print posters for voting locations.

#8-REVIEW AND IMPACT OF NEW LEGISLATION

HB 369: Sent to Governor. Establishes nonpartisan elections for certain county officers and district attorneys in consolidated law enforcement counties where the coroner position has been abolished. *Effective January 1, 2028.*

Sent to House for approval:

SB 214: Voting system modernization.

- Requires non-QR code ballot marking systems by 2027
- Mandates uniform statewide election equipment
- Establishes advisory committee for certification
- Adds ballot-on-demand security requirements
- Allows expedited voting for voters with young children
- Requires discrepancy investigations and OCR audit pilot

HB 960 (SUB): Omnibus elections bill.

- Requires public posting of eligible voter lists
- Authorizes fines for failure to remove challenged registrations
- Mandates hand-marked paper ballots (effective July 1, 2026, with exceptions)
- Requires posting of voter participation and ballot images
- Requires hand recounts at $\leq 2\%$ margin
- Updates audit procedures and oversight

Sine Die: April 2

Chair Allen asked did the DRE received any information from the Secretary of State's office

Director Williams answered that a notice was forwarded to election officials to be on standby for more information.

Mrs. Crawford recommended that the Director start reviewing budgetary impact and

getting costs regarding items needed, due to the failed legislation (SB 214) in the General Assembly.

Director Williams responded that she would draft an estimate. She confirmed that it will be Millions.

Mr. Selby requested the legal impact of the 2 bills not passing and the path forward to complying

Attorney Pachuta provided a brief overview SB 189:

- No changes for the General Primary election, May 19th
- Law take effect on July 1, 2026
- QR Codes are not to be used to tabulate the ballots
- Currently the scanners are programmed to utilize the QR Code
- Last year SOS requested funds to reprogram the scanners
- State law requires uniform election systems (OCGA 21-2-300)
- Guidance is expected prior to deadline
- Possible Special Session called to resolve prior to July 1, 2026
- Provided possible voting method scenarios

Ms. Adams stated since we don't have a legal method of voting after July 1st, the Director shouldn't be wasting time on budgetary possibilities.

Director Williams recalled hand counting 1 contest (Presidential race) in 2020 and the amount of personnel (not volunteers) and space required to conduct a tally. She said to conduct it was a large undertaking.

#9-APPROVAL OF INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENTS (IGAS):

- City of Fairburn
- City of South Fulton

Director Williams explained that the IGAs:

- Same Standard agreements between both cities
- No additional Cost the election will be conducted in conjunction with the General Primary Election
- Runoff Scenarios: no state or county runoff the cities will incur cost, State or county runoff no cost to cities

Chair Allen entertained a motion to approve the Intergovernmental Agreements (IGAs) for the City of Fairburn and South Fulton. The motion was made by **Ms. Adams**, seconded by **Mrs. Crawford**, and carried by a unanimous vote of 4-0.

Chair Allen requested Director Williams provide an overview.

Director Williams explained the overall process outlined in the information the BRE received.

Chair Allen requested legal counsel to speak to the legality of the process.

Attorney Pachuta referenced O.C.G.A 21-2-382 that governs the process for handling Absentee by Mail (ABM).

Chair Allen inquired about case law on the ABM process

Attorney Pachuta answered yes, a state and federal judge both agreed that this process was allowable in accordance with the election code.

Ms. Adams asked if the public will be permitted to view this process of the couriers returning to the Hub with materials.

Director Williams responded that it would be difficult logistically, but she will confer with legal on the how to proceed.

Chair Allen requested legal provide clarity to the BRE and DRE on the public's ability to access secure areas

Ms. Adams explained that because you're moving ballots, even if it's not allowed the DRE should allow public access to be transparent.

Director Williams responded per SOS directives the DRE is required to remove ballots after the 1500 count. She said no one has ever asked to view the secure area upon returning to the Election's Hub.

Attorney Pachuta responded that she would confirm allowable public access for this process.

Ms. Selby asked if there are safeguards in place for this process and does she have any concerns.

Director Williams outlined the process and shared checks and balances that streamlined the process. Madam Director responded no concerns due the process and procedures implemented.

Ms. Adams asked if the information in the BRE packet information was provided online.

Director Williams answered no, the DRE's Standard Operation Procedures (SOPs) are not provided online.

Ms. Adams requested additional time to review the BRE proposed policy, because it was disseminated today.

- BOC correspondence on assistance with identifying possible locations

Director Williams explained that we moved out Manning Oaks Elementary School due parental complaints. The DRE surveyed the area and found the Istanbul Cultural Center.

- location was clean and well maintained
- Adequate spacing for voters
- Owners/ Facilitators were very kind

Madam Director explained that due to some racist rhetoric on social media the location has decline to be a polling place.

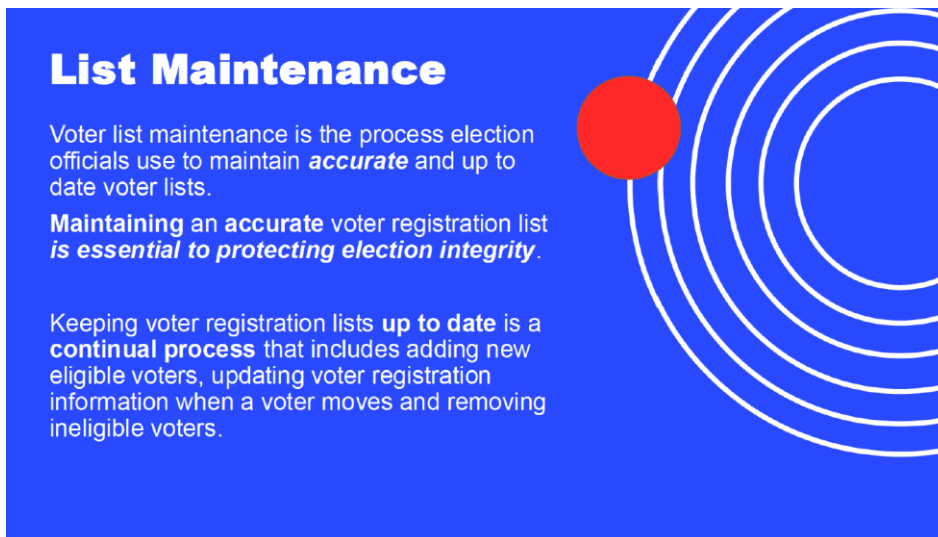
Chair Allen asked did anyone from the city expressed concerns prior to social media. Madam Chair asked if they

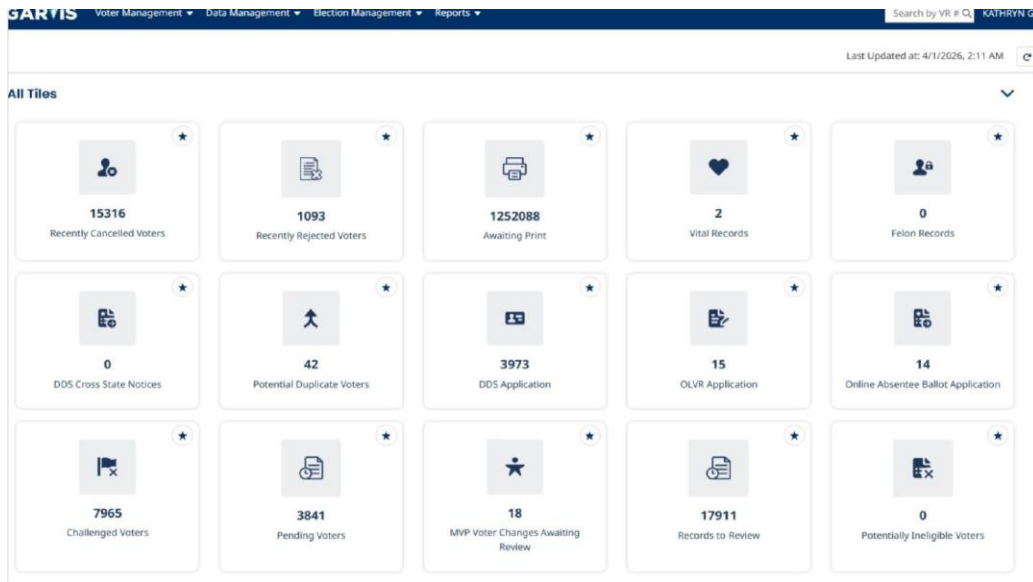
Director Williams explained that the DRE utilizes all types of Faith based facilities and the only thing that is considered is ADA compliant and adequate space

Director Williams thanked Istanbul Cultural Center and expressed the DRE's and disappointment with the removal of this location.

Chief Glenn greeted the BRE and public and began presenting on List Maintenance Process:

LIST MAINTENANCE DDS and OLVR APPLICATIONS; MVP

New Voters are added through Department of Driver Services (DDS) and Online Voter Registration (OLVR) Applications. Staff process these applications first by searching to see if the voter record currently exists. If the record exists, the record is updated. If there's no record found, staff will process as a new application. The application will go through the verification process which is built into GARViS (Georgia Registered Voter information System).

My Voter Page (MVP) allows voters to update their record with new information through the online portal. Staff process these updates if the voter's signature is attached to the request.

MISCELLANEOUS LIST MAINTENANCE

National Change of Address (NCOA) Out of County and Out of State

O.C.G.A. § 21-2-233 Comparison of change of address information supplied by United States Postal Service with electors list; removal from list of electors; notice to electors □ The Secretary of State's Office receives a list of voters that have changed their address with the United States Postal Service (USPS) □ This list is used to print and send Confirmation Notices to mail to voters who appear to have moved outside of their current county

ERIC Cross State □

ERIC (Electronic Registration Information Center) compares our data from other states to determine if one of our voters has more recent voter registration or driver services record in another state. □ ERIC transmits to its member states a list of voters with more recent activity in other states. These electors are mailed a notice to their best address asking them to respond within 40- days □ The notice will prompt the voter to cancel their Georgia registration if the elector has moved to another state. □ If the individual does not respond within 40- days, the elector will be moved to inactive status □ SOS conducts this mailing at a minimum every odd year

RETURNED MAIL

When the department of registration receive returned mail, it is processed in GARVIS and the elector's status is changed to inactive. If a forwarding address is noted on the returned mail, standard operating procedures require staff to send a request to the voter at their new address requesting that they update their voter record.

Voter Education and Outreach

VEO Division Support to Voter Registration

The **Fulton County VEO Division** plays a critical role in supporting the Voter Registration Division by assisting with the verification and correction of residential address records.

Provides outreach and coordination with **local colleges and universities** to ensure student voter records reflect accurate residential addresses.

Works with **homeless shelters and community partners** to ensure individuals experiencing homelessness are properly registered in accordance with voter registration guidelines.

Assists with address verification for residents of **assisted living and senior living facilities**, helping maintain accurate voter records.

These efforts help ensure **accurate voter rolls, proper precinct assignment, and improved voter access to the correct ballot styles.**

GIS-GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION SYSTEM

On a monthly basis, the GIS Team performs an audit of the voter rolls to include the following:

Voter Records for mismatching with GIS Precincts: staff have to research right precinct value through Voting District Map Viewer, Google map, Bing map or other resources

Duplicated Voters: extracted the voter who has same name and address; staff have to research and merge if duplicate record is found

Invalid Addresses: ungeocoded address through geocoding process; staff have to research through Google map, Bing map or other resources; attached note for factors of invalid address

Commercial Address list: extracted the address from Tax Parcel data which has commercial LUC (Land Use Code); included some addresses for shelters those are not sure for considering residential address or not

Chair Allen asked when did the GARViS registration tool implemented.

Chief Glenn responded that SOS introduced this mechanism in December 2025, but the DRE was still conducting elections. The DRE began processing in January 2026.

Madam Chief shared the Voter Registration Division, dashboard started with 53K+ items and that has been reduced to 13K+.

Chair Allen inquired about personnel.

Chief Glenn provided a total of 16 personnel including supervisors. She explained that the entire team, including her completes list maintenance daily.

Ms. Adams expressed concerns regarding ERIC (Electronic Registration Information Center) because not all states participate in this program. She asked Chief Glenn about ERIC and Georgia’s boarding states: South Carolina, North Carolina, Alabama, Tennessee, Florida. ERIC: <https://ericstates.org/>
