PREPARATION FOR ELECTION / WORK SUMMARY:

For the month of March, the Advance Voting Division has been actively engaged in planning and preparation for the upcoming May 19 General Primary/Special Election.

Recruitment efforts remain ongoing to ensure adequate staffing levels and operational readiness across all Advance Voting locations. Focus has been placed on securing qualified personnel to support both managerial and clerical functions.

In parallel, strategic planning initiatives have begun for the broader 2026 Election Events.

Professional development and training were also key priorities during this period. Participation included attendance at the Georgia Association of Voter Registration and Elections Officials (GAVREO) Conference in Athens, Georgia. The conference provided valuable insights into best practices, interactive tabletop exercises, and updates on election procedures and legislative changes. Additionally, participation in the Secretary of State Election Training further supported alignment with statewide requirements and expectations.

The Division continues to maintain consistent coordination through weekly meetings with Division Managers. These meetings serve to align priorities, provide operational updates, and ensure clear and consistent communication across all Advance Voting functions.

PREPARATION FOR ELECTION / WORK SUMMARY:	
The 2026 Elections and Operating budget was approved by the Fulton County Board of Commissions (BOC) on January 21, 2026. The approved 2026 Elections budget totals \$26.1 Million and includes funding for four election cycles during the year. In addition, the Operating budget is \$5.4 Million, which funds the salaries of permanent personnel, employee benefits, insurance, software and hardware costs. As part of the approval process, the Fulton County BOC required a total reduction of \$1.3 Million. This consisted of: A \$1 Million reduction by the Fulton County BOC, and an additional 1% reduction of \$348K mandated by the Finance department for all departments. We made the following reductions to the 2026 Elections budget to achieve the required total \$1.3 Million reduction. The temp agency bids were hybrid with higher markup rates for temps who are driving vs non-driving temps. The temp markup rates were updated in the 2026 Elections budget which reduced the total temp labor costs. We reduced the total number of advanced voting election sites from 37 down to 32. Some of the temporary staffing start dates were delayed by one week. We also eliminated 1 Sunday of advanced voting which reduced the staff overtime costs. Following the release of the 2026 Elections funds by the Finance department in February 2026, we then completed the setup of the 2026 Elections budget for the 4 elections in the Accounting system. We are processing vendor invoices for the established purchase orders funded by the approved Elections budget. We are processing the few remaining 2025 expenses that were received in 2026. We continue to review the budget to actual expenditures for the 2025 Election cycles. We are generating both the Accounting and Purchase order reports to track costs and to adhere to our 2025 budgets.

 - Confirming proper functionality and ensuring software versions were up to date.
 - Verifying full battery charge and charging capability.
- Continued diagnostic testing of Uninterruptible Power Supply (UPS) units to verify battery integrity and charging performance before placement into storage for future deployment.
- Completed the Georgia Secretary of State (SOS) required county election equipment inventory, ensuring compliance with state reporting standards and maintaining accurate accountability of all election-related technology assets.
- Continued coordinating and developing connectivity plans for all election support devices, including cell phones, iPads, and hotspots, in collaboration with FCIT, ensuring proper network configuration, deployment readiness, and secure connectivity for all polling locations.

For the month of March 2026, the Supply and Logistics Division worked on and or completed the following:

- The Supply and Logistics Manager attended the Statewide Georgia Association of Registration and Election Officials or GAVREO conference in Athens Georgia.
- Performed site visits at current polling locations to update information on the facilities and to verify how locations were set up.
- Supply and Logistics staff started creating delivery schedules for both Advance Voting and Election Day equipment deliveries.
- 18 Fulton County Time-limited couriers were onboarded to staff the elections warehouse and to begin preparing for the May 19, 2026, General Primary.
- 5 temporary Fleet Coordinators were onboard to begin preparing the logistics for the upcoming May 19, 2026, General Primary.
- Processed all new Fulton County Registration and Elections fleet additions in preparation for use during the 2026 election cycle.
- Staff worked on creating logistics plans for Advance Voting and Election Day polling location support for the May 19, 2026, General Primary.
- Staff finished the inventory of the election supplies in the elections warehouse. We were able to confirm the number of supplies we have ready for the upcoming 2026 election cycle.
- Completed creating supply orders for Advance Voting and Election Day supplies that will be needed for the upcoming 2026 election cycle.
- The staff continued to conduct day-to-day logistics operations for the Elections Warehouse.

VOTER EDUCATION

DATE OF REPORT: March 31, 2026

PREPARATION FOR ELECTION / WORK SUMMARY:

In March, the Voter Education and Outreach (VEO) team focused on outreach at all Fulton County Libraries and on high school students at APS and Fulton County schools. The team began working with senior centers to assist voters with absentee ballot applications and organized poll worker recruitment opportunities in North Fulton County.

The VEO team is continuing to conduct Deputy Registrar training and work with Deputy Registrars to conduct voter registration drives throughout the county. The VEO team is continually planning events and will continue to contact schools, communities, nonprofit organizations, and government officials to schedule future events throughout the county.

The VEO manager participates in legislative meetings as needed to discuss all bills that impact the elections department and attends committee meetings to hear election bills. The VEO manager also worked with the High Museum of Art to continue the partnership of hosting VEO events at the Museum. Additionally, the VEO manager began conducting Elections Academy Classes, which will run through October.

Currently, these are the final bills being tracked that have potential movement of passage.

HB 369: This bill was sent to the Governor for signature. Establishes nonpartisan elections for certain county officers and district attorneys in a consolidated law enforcement county where the elected office of county coroner has been abolished. Effective: January 1, 2028.

SB 397

An Omnibus elections bill that prohibits the Secretary of State, Board of Registrars, Election Superintendents, or any state department from participating in multistate voter list organizations that share voter registration data for voter list maintenance purposes. It establishes that any rules adopted by the State Election Board within 60 days of a presidential, general, or special primary, general election or runoff will take effect 30 days after the election. The administrative transfer of the State Election Board to the State Accounting Office is mandated. County Boards of Registrars or Election Superintendents are required to make a list of electors in their county available for public inspection at no cost, either at their offices or websites. Election officials are required to record video surveillance of ballot drop boxes at advance voting locations after voting hours. If 24/7 surveillance is not feasible, drop boxes must be locked and made inaccessible. These video recordings must be retained, with officials having the option to live-stream the surveillance. The return of absentee ballots during the weekend before Election Day is prohibited, and municipalities may opt out of Saturday voting, except when an election coincides with a county or state

primary, election or runoff. Election officials must report and post online the number of absentee ballots issued, returned, and rejected each day, as well as the number of people who voted during early voting and the number of nonpartisan ballots requested. During absentee voting and for three days following an election, officials must report and post the number of provisional ballots cast, verified, accepted and rejected. Poll watchers are granted access to areas where tabulation processes, such as adjudication of provisional ballots and verification of absentee ballots, are taking place. After the final upload of unofficial election results on election night, election officials are required to publish a report showing vote totals by precinct and voting method, excluding certain ballots like military, overseas, provisional or those needing review. This report must be posted online by 11:59 P.M. or, if not possible, in a publicly accessible location 24/7. The bill also exempts the 90-day call provision for special elections presenting questions to voters when held in conjunction with statewide primaries or special elections. Additionally, the time between the call for special primaries and the election is extended to 60 days, while the time between the call for special elections and the election is extended to 45 days. The bill eliminates the ability to hold special elections on the third Tuesday in September.

SB 214: Provides that no earlier than February 1, 2027, and all elections occurring after December 31, 2027, must be conducted with the use of scanning ballots marked by electronic ballot markers that do not utilize QR codes for use in tabulation or with an optical scanning voting system utilizing paper ballots and ballot-on-demand printing equipment. The bill requires ballots to be tabulated by ballot scanners that create scanned images of the tabulated ballots.

The bill requires the state to furnish a uniform system of election equipment for use in each county as soon as possible after February 1, 2027. The bill establishes an advisory committee in order to assist the Secretary of State in certifying the new uniform system of election equipment. The bill provides for the preparation, testing, custody, and security of ballot-on-demand printing equipment. The bill allows electors accompanied by one or more children of two years of age or younger to vote without waiting in line during the period of advance voting or during specified hours on Election Day.

The bill provides for the investigation of discrepancies related to votes cast via optical scanning voting equipment. The bill requires the State Election Board to create a pilot program for the auditing of paper ballot images using optical character recognition technology. It terminates any similar pilot program conducted by the Secretary of State. This was sent to the House for approval.

HB 960 (SUB) Omnibus elections bill that requires public posting of the list of eligible voters prior to advance voting, authorizes civil fines for failure to remove registrations after successful challenges, and mandates the use of hand-marked paper ballots tabulated by optical scanners beginning July 1, 2026, with limited accessibility exceptions. Requires posting of lists of voters who cast ballots and related election data, provides statewide posting of scanned ballot images, establishes mandatory hand recounts when the margin is 2 percent or less, and modifies risk-limiting audit procedures and oversight. This bill was sent to the House for approval.
