FINANCE

DATE OF REPORT: 07/02/2026

PREPARATION FOR ELECTION / WORK SUMMARY:

The 2026 Elections and Operating budget was approved by the Fulton County Board of Commissions (BOC) on January 21, 2026. The approved 2026 Elections budget totals \$26.1 Million and includes funding for four election cycles during the year. In addition, the Operating budget is \$5.4 Million, which funds the salaries of permanent personnel, employee benefits, insurance, software and hardware costs.

As part of the approval process, the Fulton County BOC required a total reduction of \$1.3 Million. This consisted of: A \$1 Million reduction by the Fulton County BOC, and an additional 1% reduction of \$348K mandated by the Finance department for all departments.

We made the following reductions to the 2026 Elections budget to achieve the required total \$1.3 Million reduction. Several cost saving measures were implemented. The temporary staffing agency bids included hybrid markup rates that differentiated between driving and non-driving temporary staff. The markup rates were updated in the 2026 Elections budget which resulted in a reduction in temporary staff costs. Additionally, the total number of advanced voting election sites were reduced from 37 down to 32. Some of the temporary staffing start dates were delayed by one week. We also eliminated 1 Sunday of advanced voting which reduced the staff overtime costs.

The 2026 Elections budget continues to be updated as new operational requirements are identified. We are working closely with the Elections Director and management team to evaluate emerging needs and make the necessary budget revisions to ensure adequate funding for election operations.

We are processing the 2026 vendor invoices for the established purchase orders funded by the approved Elections budget. Budget-to-actual expenditures are being closely monitored, and both Accounting and Purchase Order reports are generated regularly to track costs and ensure expenditures remain within approved budget limits.

In preparation for the upcoming November and December 2026 election cycles, we have updated the temporary staffing budgets to support the statewide temporary staffing contract renewal, effective July 2026, which coincides with the beginning of the State of Georgia's fiscal year. This statewide contract provides access to the temporary staffing agencies that support election operations.

VOTER EDUCATION

DATE OF REPORT: June 30, 2026

PREPARATION FOR ELECTION / WORK SUMMARY:

In June, the Voter Education and Outreach (VEO) team focused on community outreach events across the county to promote the 2026 Runoff election. The team also dropped off voter education materials at all Fulton County city halls, libraries, and recreation centers. The VEO manager focused on outreach to all 15 municipalities, providing mayors, city council members, and city clerks with updated information about the June runoff election for use in advertising on their city websites and in newsletters. The manager also sent voter education materials to churches and senior centers within Fulton County to promote the election. The VEO team also went to a few senior centers to assist with absentee applications.

The VEO team continues to conduct Deputy Registrar training and to work with Deputy Registrars to conduct voter registration drives throughout the county.

The VEO Manager conducted training for the Risk Limiting Audit to be held after June 16, 2026, General Primary Runoff election is certified. The RLA begins on June 25 and must be completed by July 1, 2026, at 5 p.m.

The VEO Manager participated in the Special Session to ensure compliance with SB 189. As a result of the special session, the GA Legislature passed SB 3EX.

A summary of SB 3EX is below.

SB 3EX Election Equipment Specifications and Standards Committee; establish | Sen. Max Burns

- Establishes the Election Equipment Specifications and Standards Committee to develop recommendations for a new uniform statewide election system based upon hand-marked paper ballots produced using ballot-on-demand printing, including specifications, standards and implementation requirements, and requires a report to be submitted by **January 31, 2027**, to state leadership to guide implementation for the 2028 election cycle.
- The committee consists of nine members, including three electors of the state appointed by the Governor, three members of the Senate appointed by the Senate Committee on Assignments (one designated as co-chairperson) and three members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House (one designated as co-chairperson), and is authorized to seek input from the elections director of the Secretary of State's office (or designee), the executive director of the State Election Board, the Georgia Association of Voter Registration and Election Officials, cybersecurity experts and accessibility or disability experts.
- Establishes mandatory hand recount requirements for "qualified contests," defined as general election contests for Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, Attorney General, State School Superintendent, Commissioner of Insurance, Commissioner of Agriculture and Commissioner of Labor, when such contest appears as the first or second contest on the ballot and the difference between the votes received by the winning candidate and any other candidate is not more than one-half of 1 percent of total votes cast. In such cases, the Secretary of State shall order a

statewide hand recount of all ballots following certification, with corrected returns and recertification if necessary. Counties are eligible for state reimbursement of reasonable recount costs subject to completion of the recount within seventeen days.

- Revises provisions related to risk-limiting audits and updates the definition of selected contests to include statewide offices and certain federal and judicial races, including U.S. Senate, U.S. House, Supreme Court Justice, Court of Appeals Judge and Public Service Commissioner, subject to ballot position limitations.
- Amends [SB 189](#) (2024 Legislative Session) by revising Section 7, relating to removal of QR code-based ballot tabulation, to establish a new effective date of **January 1, 2028**.
- **Effective Date**: June 26, 2026

The VEO manager also provided information to staff about the rule about numbered list of voters passed at the SEB meeting on June 3, 2026, that will go into effect July 19, 2026,

The VEO Interns have also worked on a project using the 2024 November and May 19th elections to develop a list of low-voter-turnout areas that we will use to help plan our work in the fall.

The VEO team is continually planning events and will continue to contact schools, communities, nonprofit organizations, and government officials to schedule future events across the county.
