- Changes in establishing resolution reviewed including confirmation that each Fulton County Commissioner may appoint two members and resident requirements for district appointments.
- Website will be updated with both resolutions.

- Official status of District 1 (Shanti Vissa) and District 3 (Elon Osby) members will be confirmed with the Clerk to the Commission's Office by <u>Fran Calhoun</u> after review of Bylaws and Establishing Resolution.

### Dr. Karcheik Sims-Alvarado, Chair

- Discovered typos, will resubmit report to <u>Fran Calhoun</u> to update record.
- <u>Chair and Vice-Chair Marcus Coleman</u> presented annual report at the January 18, 2023 Fulton County Board of Commissioners meeting. During the meeting, the Reparations Task Force was awarded \$250,000 to support two research studies: empirical and feasibility.
  - o Empirical study will research specific areas, to be determined by full task force at later date, and lead to reparations recommendations. Data for this

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study will be quantitative and qualitative. Following reparations recommendations, the feasibility study will determine costs and number of years to complete.

o Timeline for study: April 2023-November 2024

• Funding will be used for two town halls. Dates and locations need to be determined, suggested first town hall be at Morehouse.

#### 7. Survey and Poll

#### Dr. Karcheik Sims-Alvarado, Chair

- Funding for surveys and polls will be necessary and task force will need to adjust budget.
- Reminded members Olivia is only with the task force until May 2023 and has limited funding.
- Provided examples of changes in Reparations polls over time and education needed to inform the public.
- Survey questions will be presented at the next meeting.

### Olivia Reneau

- Will circulate Reparations public opinion poll methodology to members before next meeting including sample surveys.
- Financial resources for poll limited to \$500 for research reimbursements.
- Suggested joining external research contract team to help with the scale of survey needed.
  - Fran Calhoun will determine resident database resources used by Fulton County.
    Contract with customer service provider will be reviewed to determine potential costs.
- 8. Historical Nature of Reparations Task Force
- <u>Chair</u> and <u>Vice-Chair</u> provided examples of national and local media coverage of the historical nature of the Reparations Task Force. Both would like more media coverage and public attention to efforts.
