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# **BRIEF NOTES**

Historic Significance of Land Land-Based Compensation Possible Sites for Examination Related Research



WHEREAS, reparations are also defined as the making of amends for a wrong one has done, by paying money to or otherwise helping those who have been wronged; and

WHEREAS, reparations can take numerous forms, including: individual monetary payments, settlements, scholarships, wriving of fees, systemic initiatives to offset injustices, land-based compensation elated to independence, apologies and acknowledgements of the injustices, token measures such as naming a building after someone, or the removal of monuments and renaming of streets that honor slave owners and defenders of slavery; and

WHEREAS, the Fulton County Board of Commissioners seeks to explore the feasibility of reparations to Black/African-American residents of Fulton County residents by creating a taskforce to research the feasibility of slavery reparations for Black/African-American who live in Fulton County; and

# "LAND-BASED COMPENSATION RELATED TO INDEPENDENCE"

Continuing down our existing path to communities like Piney Grove, Johnsontown, Peoplestown

#### "SCHOLARSHIPS"

Examining scholarship programs from other areas and their efficacy, conduct a feasibility study on Fulton County

#### "WAIVING OF FEES"

Consider ways that Black residents of Fulton County are uniquely cost-burdened as a result of derivative conditions of slavery (ex. health outcomes)

#### "SYSTEMIC INITIATIVES TO OFFSET INJUSTICES"

Examine programs from other areas and their efficacy, present a "state of the county" on the topic



It might be helpful to justify the research approach up to this point.

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## Why Land?

#### SIGNIFICANCE TO BLACK PEOPLE

Historical sources repeatedly demonstrate the significance of land acquisition to Black people in the United States

#### EASE OF DOCUMENTATION

Land transfers are easier to trace, quantify, and analyze than many other avenues of possible discrimination

#### WEALTH-BUILDING ASSET

Home and land ownership is a crucial link in the chain of generational and intergenerational wealth building

#### UNIVERSAL APPEAL

Land ownership is foundational to the American republic, a sentiment that is shared across much of the political spectrum

# EXAMPLES OF LAND-BASED COMPENSATION

Parallel efforts to correct historic wrong-doings make up the "policy stream"

## Land Returns, Reconciliation, and Others

In 2010, the Obama administration authorized the USDA to pay \$1.25 bil to black American farmers in the Pigford v.


In 2018, the City of

the closest living

# POSSIBLE SITES FOR EXAMINATION

This month's exploration has yielded approx. a dozen sites for further research

- Can/should the task force partner with existing organizations to accelerate this work (e.g. Buckhead Heritage Foundation)
- How will the end of year report be written?

## RELATED RESEARCH

- 1. There is *little to no* public opinion polling on municipal reparations efforts, and none at the county level
- 2. Incorporating and uplifting the voices of those reparations aims to benefit should\* be centered in the reparations/reconciliation process
- 3. Fulton County *does not appear* to have made efforts to incorporate direct feedback on the topic of reparations in the policymaking process

I believe this above warrants the construction and dissemination of a brief survey/poll on reparations amongst Fulton County residents.

Survey would be conducted in conjunction with the Hart Leadership Program, with research ethics oversight from the Duke Institutional Review Board.
